IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DECLARATION ON THE
DENUCLEARIZATION OF AFRICAReport of the Secretary-General

1. By resolution 36/86 A of 9 December 1981, entitled "Nuclear capability of South Africa", the General Assembly, having examined the report of the Secretary-General of 9 September 1980 (A/35/402 and Corr. 1) and his report of 3 September 1981 (A/36/430) on the nuclear capability of South Africa, inter alia, deplored the massive build-up of South Africa's military machine, including its frenzied acquisition of nuclear-weapon capability for repressive and aggressive purposes and as an instrument of blackmail; reaffirmed that South Africa's plans and capability in the nuclear field constituted a very grave danger to international peace and security and, in particular, jeopardized the security of African States and increased the danger of the proliferation of nuclear weapons; called upon all States, corporations, institutions and individuals to terminate forthwith all military and nuclear collaboration with South Africa, including the provision to it of such related materials as computers, electronic equipment and related technology; and requested the Secretary-General to continue to follow closely South Africa's evolution in the nuclear field and to report thereon to the General Assembly at its thirty-seventh session.

2. Pursuant to the above resolution, the Secretary-General has followed closely South Africa's activities in that area. The Secretary-General has neither received nor identified any information regarding South Africa's nuclear evolution in the nuclear field and therefore has nothing to add to his earlier reports.
