Replace section 5, Resolution on Cyprus, by the following:

5. Resolution on Cyprus

The Third Conference of Labour Ministers of the Non-Aligned Countries and Other Developing Countries, held at Managua, Nicaragua, from 10 to 12 May 1984,

Recalling the relevant resolutions of the United Nations on the question of Cyprus and in particular Security Council resolutions 365 (1974), 367 (1975), 541 (1983) and 550 (1984), and the unanimously adopted General Assembly resolution 3312 (XXIX), and deploring that these resolutions have not yet been implemented.

<u>Gravely concerned</u> at the continuing foreign military occupation of part of the territory of the Republic of Cyprus,

<u>Gravely concerned</u> also at the aggravation of the crisis as a direct result of further secessionist acts carried out by the foreign occupying authorities and the Turkish-Cypriot side in the occupied part of the Republic of Cyprus,

<u>Condemning</u> all efforts or actions aimed at changing the demographic structure of Cyprus,

1. <u>Reattirms</u> its full support for the sovereignty, independence, territorial integrity, unity and non-aligned status of Cyprus;

2. <u>Reaffirms</u> further the relevant resolutions and decisions of the United Nations and the content of the declarations and communiques of the non-aligned countries on the question of Cyprus and demands their effective and immediate implementation;

3. <u>Demands</u> the immediate withdrawal of the foreign occupation forces whose presence makes possible, inter alia, the aforesaid secessionist acts;

4. <u>Condemns</u> the atoresaid secessionist acts, declares them null and void and urges that they be terminated forthwith;

5. <u>Urges</u> full respect for the human rights of all Cypriots and that action be taken to enable the refugees to return to their homes in safety;

6. <u>Calls upon</u> all States to refrain from any action that could jeopardize the full territorial integrity, sovereignty and unity of the Republic of Cyprus;

7. <u>Reiterates</u> its support of the mission of good offices of the Secretary-General of the United Nations in the search for an early solution to the guestion of Cyprus under the relevant resolutions of the Security Council of the United Nations.
