CONCLUSION OF EFFECTIVEINTERNATIONALARRANGEMENTSON THE STRENQTHENINQ OF THE SECURITY OF NON-NUCLEAR-WEAPON STATES AGAINST THE USE OR THREAT OF USE OF NUCLEAR WEAPONS

Report of the First Committee

I, INTRODUCTION

1. The item entitled "Conclusion of \bullet ffaotivo international arrangements on the strengthening of the security of non-nuclear-weapon States against the use or threat of use of nuclear weapons" war included in the provisional agenda of the forty-third session in accordanao with General Assembly resolution 42/31 of 30 November 1967,

2. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 23 September 1988, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include thr item in its agenda and to allocate it to the First Committee.

3. At its 2nd meeting, on 12 October, the First Committee decided to hold a general debate on the disarmament items allocated to it, namely items 51 to 69 and 139, 141 and 145. The deliberations on those items took place between the 3rd and the 25th meetings, from 17 October to 2 November (see A/C.1/43/PV.3..25). Consideration of and action on draft resolutions on those items took place between 3 and 18 November (see A/C.1/43/PV.26-43).

II, CONSIDERATION *OF* DRAFT **RESOLUTION**

5. On 31 Oatobrr 1988, Angola, Bulgaria, the Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, Czechoslovakia, the Lar Peopler's Democratic Republic, Mongolia and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics submitted a draft resolution entitled "Conclusion of effective international arrangements on the strengthening of the security of non-nualoar-weapon States against the use or throat of use of nuclear weapons" (A/C.1/43/L.21). The draft resolution was introduced by the representative of Bulgaria at the 31at meeting, on 9 November,

6. At its 33rd mooting on 10 November, the Committee adopted draft resolution A/C.1/43/L.21 by a recorded vote of 9% to 17, with 16 abstentions (see para. 7). The voting was a8 follows: 2/

III. RECOMMENDATION OF THE FIRST COMMITTEE

7. Thr First Committee recommends to the General Assembly thr adoption of the following draft resolution;

Conclusion of effective international arrangements on the strengthening of the security of non-nuclear-weapon States against the use or threat of use of nuclear weapons

The General Assembly,

<u>Deeply concerned</u> at the continuing eccalation of the arms race, in particular the nuclear arms race, and the possibility of the use or threat of use of nuclear weapons,

<u>Convinced</u> that nuclear disarmament and the complete elimination of nuclear weapons are essential to remove the danger of war,

<u>Considering</u> that, until complete nuclear disarmament is \bullet obvious on a universal basis, it is imperative for the international community to develop

effective arrangements $\diamond \Box = \circ$ nauro the rocurity of non-nuclear-weapon States against thr use or throat of use of nuclear weapons,

Noting the general desire to conclude $\checkmark \checkmark \square \mathbb{W} \diamond \mathbb{H} \diamond \square$ international measures to that end at an early date,

Noting also the unilateral declarations on the rocurity of non-nuclear-weapon States against the use or throat of use of nuclear weapons, made by all nuclear-weapon States,

<u>Desirous</u> of promoting the implementation of paragraph 59 of the Final Document of the Tenth Special Session of the General Assembly, 3/ the first special session devoted to disarmament,

<u>Recognizing</u> that effective measures of such security aaaurancea to non-nuclrar-wrapon States would constitute an important contribution to the non-proliferation of nuclear woapona,

<u>Aware</u> of the in-depth negotiations on this \bullet ubjrct in the Conference on Disarmament during the past ton years,

Recalling the relevant parts of the special report of the Committee on Disarmament $\underline{4}$ submitted to the General Assembly at its twelfth special aeaaion, $\underline{5}$ the second aprcial session devoted to disarmament, and of the special report of the Conference on Disarmament submitted to the Aaaembly at its fifteenth special aeaaion, $\underline{6}$ the third special aeaaion devoted to disarmament, as well as of the annual report of the conference on its 1988 aeaaion, $\underline{7}$

<u>Welcoming</u> the unanimous aupport in the Conference on Disarmament to continuing the search for a common approach to the aubatanco or negative security aaaurancea and, *in* particular, to a "common formula", which could be included in a legally binding instrument,

<u>Recognizing</u> the need for a fresh look at the issue, in particular by the nualrar-weapon States, in order to overcome the difficulties \bullet ncountored at the nrgotiationa in previous years,

Noting the proposals on this subject submitted to the Conference on Disarmamont, $\underline{a}/$

<u>Considering</u> that the non-nuclear-wrapona States having no nuclear weapons on their territorira have every right to receive reliable, uniform and unconditional international legal assurances against the use or threat of uae of nuclear weapons,

1. <u>Reaffirms</u> the urgent need, pending thr \bigcirc chiavomont of complete nuclear disarmament, to reach an early \bigcirc grrmmnt on effective international arrangements to \bigcirc aaura non-nuclear-weapon States against tha use or threat of use of nuclear weapons;

2. <u>Recommends</u> that the Conference on Disarmament pursue intrnaivr negotiation6 in its <u>Ad Hoc</u> Committee on Effective International Arrangementa to Assure Non-Nuclear Weapon States against tha Use or Threat of Uaa of Nuclear Weapons at the beginning of its 1989 session, with a view to reaching ouch an agreement, taking into account the widespread rupport in the Conference for the conclusion of an international convention;

3. Appeals to all Stataa, in particular the nuclear-weapon States, to demonstrate willingnear and \bigcirc xerciao the flexibility necessary to reach agreement on a common approach to, including thr poraibility of a common formula in, an international inatrument or instruments of a legally binding character, to assure non-nuclear-weapon States against the use or throat of use of nuclear weapons;

4. <u>Decides</u> to include in the provisional agenda of its forty-fourth aeaaion the item entitled "Conclusion of \bullet foctive international arrangements on the strengthening of the $\Box \odot \diamond \Box + \diamond \Box$ of non-nuclear-weapon States against the use or threat of use of nuclear weapons".
