LIABILITY FOR THE ILLEGAL TRANSFER AND/OR USE OF PROHIBITED WEAPONS AND WEAPONS OR SUBSTANCES WHICH CAUSE UNNECESSARY HUMAN SUFFERING

### Report of the First Committee

Rapporteur: Mr. Virgilio A, REYES (Philippines)

### I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. The item entitled "Liability for the illegal transfer and/or use of prohibited weapons and weapons or substances which cause unnecessary human suffering" was included as a supplementary item in the agenda of the forty-third session in accordance with a letter dated 19 Auguat 1988 from the Permanent Representative of Trinidad and Tobago to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General (A/43/195).
- 2. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 23 September 1988, the General Asuembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include the item in its agenda and to allocate it to the **First** Committee.
- 3. At its 2nd meeting, on 12 October 1988, the First Committee decided to hold a general debate on the disarmament items allocated to it, namely items 51 to 69, 139, 141 and 145, The deliberations on those items took place at the 3rd to 25th meetings, from 17 October to 2 November (see A/C.1/43/PV.3-25). Consideration of and action on draft resolutions on those items took place between 3 and 18 November (see A/C.1/43/PV.26-43).
- 4, In connection with item 145, the First Committee had before it the letter referred to in paragraph 1.

# II, CONSIDERATION OF DRAFT RESOLUTION A/C.1/43/L.35 and DRAFT DECI: ON A/C.1/43/L.35 AND Rev.1

5. On 31 October, Guyana, Saint Lucia, Trinidad and Tobago, and Vanuatu submitted a draft revolution entitled "Liability for the illegal transfer and/or use of prohibited wraponr and weeponr or rubrancer which cause unnecessary human suffering" (\(\lambda/C.1/43/L.35\)). The draft revolution war introduced by the representative of Trinidad and Tobago at the 30th meeting, on 8 November, and read as follower:

### "The General Assembly,

"Concerned about the development ond reliferation of new types of wraponr of mass dertruction,

"Mindful of the grave consequences of the use of weaponr of mass dertruation or weaponr which cause unnecearary human ruffering,

"Reaffirming that the use of weapons of mass dertruction or weapons which cause unnecessary human ruffering would be a violation of the Charter of the United Nations and a crime against humanity,

"Considering that illicit drug trafficking across national frontiers is accompanied by the transfer and use of weapons which cause unnecessary human ruffering,

"Convinced of the need to take steps to prevent the use of weapon8 of mass destruction or weapons which cause unnecessary human suffering, and which would be in furtherance of the disarmament process,

"Convinced also of the need for increased international co-operation is criminal justice administration and for speedy and public trial of transactional offenderr through acceptable invortigative and judicial procedures,

- "1. Requests the Secretary-General to rubmit a report to the General Assembly at its forty-fourth session on the illegal transfer and/or use of prohibited weapons of mass dertruction and weapons which cause unnecessary human suffering and on measures for preventing such transfer and/or use, including the procedure8 and mechanisms for increased international co-operation in oriminal justice administration;
- "2. <u>Decides</u> to include in the provisional agenda of its forty-fourth session the item entitled 'Liability for the illegal transfer and/or use of prohibited weeponr and weapons or substances which cause unnecessary human suffering: report of the Secretary-General'".
- 6. On 16 November, the sponsors submitted a revised draft decision (A/C.1/43/L.35/Rev.1), which war later also rponrored byby Antiqua and Barbuda, the Bahamas, Barbados, Grenada, Saint Kitts and Nevis a n d Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, containing the following changer:

- (a) Preambular paragraphs 1 to 6 and operative paragraph 1 were deleted;
- (b) The phrase "report by the Secretary-General" at the end of operative paragraph 2 war deleted,
- 7. At its 42nd meeting, on 18 November, the Committee adopted the revised draft decision without a vote (see para. 8).

### III, RECOMMENDATION OF THE FIRST COMMITTEE

8. The First Committee recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft decision;

Liability for the illegal transfer and/use of prohibited weapons and weapons or substances which cause unnecessary human suffering

The General Assembly decides to include in the provisional agenda of its forty-fourth session the item entitled "Liability for the illegal transfer and/or use of prohibited weapons and weapon8 or substances which cause unnecessary human auf fering".
