I have the honour to forward the enclosed Communiqu6 adopted by the Co-ordinating Bureau of Non-Aligned Countries on 3 January 1989 regarding the current disinformation campaign and threats of aggression against the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, with the request that it be circulated as a document of the General Assembly, under items **ontitled** "Declaration of the Assembly of Heads of State and Government of the Organisation of African Unity on the aerial and naval military attack against the Socialist People's Libyan Arab Jamahiriya by the present United States Administration in April 1986" and "Chemical and bacteriological (biological) weanons", and of the Security Cruncil.

ANNEX

<u>Communiqué issued on 3 January 1989 by the Coordinating Bureau</u> of Non-Aligned Countries regarding the disinformation and threats against the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya

1. The Co-ordinating Bureau of Non-Aligned Countries **met** in New York on 3 January 1989. On that occasion, the Bureau heard a statement from the **representative** of the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya regarding the current disinformation campaign in the United States, as well as threats **of** aggression against the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya.

2. Recalling that similar threats and media campaigns had preceded the aerial and naval attacks by the United States on 15 April 1986 against the Libyan cities of Tripoli and Benghazi, the Bureau expressed deep concern and warned that the current campaign and threats might *serve* as a pretext for launching fresh acts of aggression against the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya.

3. The Bureau noted the sovereign and unprecedented **offer**, freely made by the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, to make the subject of international inspection the pharmaceutical factories alleged to be plants for the production of chemical weapons,

4. The Bureau rejected selected and unilateral condemnations as well as aggressive provocations against non-aligned countries. It recalled that the Eighth Conference of Heads of State or Government of the Non-Aligned Countries had **called** upon the United States to desist **from** undertaking acts of aggression and provocation against the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya in violation **of** international law and the Charter of the United Nations.

5. The Bureau expressed deep concern and regret at the tendency Ly some States to abuse international forums by turning them into platforms for disinformation campaigns and attacks against non-aligned countries. It reiterated the Non-Aligned Movement's support for, and solidarity with, the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya in the defence of its independence, sovereignty and territorial integrity.
