I have the honour to transmit to you the text of the Model Answer for the OSCE Information Exchange on Small Arms and Light Weapons of 2001 (see appendix II), in accordance with decision 9/02 of the Forum for Security Cooperation of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (see appendix I).

The Model Answer was prepared by the OSCE Conflict Prevention Centre in order to assist the participating States in fulfilling their commitments regarding the June 2001 information exchange, as mandated by the OSCE Document on Small Arms and Light Weapons. The document was designed to support participating States in their efforts to update their submissions of last year. It was based in part on an overview of the June 2001 information exchange, also prepared by the Conflict Prevention Centre at the request of the Forum for Security Cooperation. The overview, which reflected the general trends and patterns in the information shared by participating States, served the dual purpose of informing the Workshop on the Implementation of the OSCE Document, held on 4 and 5 February 2002, and providing useful information to delegations about practices and procedures implemented by the participating States.

I would be grateful if you could ensure that the text of the OSCE Model Answer on small arms and light weapons is distributed to all States Members of the United Nations.
