**Statement of the European Union, Switzerland, the United States
and Canada on the situation in northern Mali**

Bamako, 6 September 2007

The European Union member States and the European Commission, Switzerland, the United States and Canada, which are represented in Bamako, express their deep concern over the deteriorating situation in northern Mali. They consider the use of violence to represent a threat to the stability and security of the regions of northern Mali.

They resolutely condemn the taking of hostages and use of landmines, which have already claimed a number of victims and which expose the civilian populations of the region to increased risks.

The European Union member States and the European Commission, Switzerland, the United States and Canada reaffirm their support for the efforts made by the Government of Mali and the 23 May Democratic Alliance for Change in safeguarding peace, while respecting the territorial integrity and national unity of Mali.

They reiterate their confidence in the process initiated by the Algiers Agreement of July 2006 and the Kidal Forum of March 2007 and their willingness to continue and strengthen their cooperation for the benefit of all the people of Mali.
