Appointments to fill vacancies in subsidiary organs and other appointments: appointment of members of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions

Report of the Fifth Committee

1. At its 2nd plenary meeting, on 18 September 2009, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include in the agenda of its sixty-fourth session the item entitled “Appointments to fill vacancies in subsidiary organs and other appointments: appointment of members of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions”.

2. At its 13th meeting, on 6 November 2009, the Fifth Committee had before it the following documents:

(a) Note by the Secretary-General concerning the vacancies in the membership of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions that would occur as a result of the expiration of the term of office of five of its members on 31 December 2009 (A/64/101);

(b) Note by the Secretary-General containing the names of nine persons nominated by their respective Governments for appointment or reappointment to the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions for a three-year term of office beginning on 1 January 2010 (A/C.5/64/4).

3. At the same meeting, the Committee proceeded to select, by secret ballot, two persons from the three candidates nominated by the Group of African States. The result of the voting was as follows:

5. Also at the same meeting, the Committee proceeded to select, by secret ballot, one person from the two candidates nominated by the Group of Asian States. The result of the voting was as follows:
