The resolutions and decisions of the General Assembly are identified as follows:

#### Regular sessions

Until the thirtieth regular session, the resolutions of the General Assembly were identified by an arabic numeral followed by a roman numeral in parentheses indicating the session (for example: resolution 3363 (XXX)). When several resolutions were adopted under the same number, each of them was identified by a capital letter placed between the two numerals (for example: resolution 3367 A (XXX), resolutions 3411 A and B (XXX), resolutions 3419 A to D (XXX)). The decisions were not numbered.

Since the thirty-first session, as part of the new system adopted for symbols of General Assembly documents, resolutions and decisions have been identified by an arabic numeral, indicating the session, followed by an oblique stroke and another arabic numeral (for example: resolution 31/1, decision 31/301). When several resolutions or decisions were adopted under the same number, each of them has been identified by a capital letter placed after the two numerals (for example: resolution 31/16 A, resolutions 31/6 A and B, decisions 31/406 A to E).

#### Special sessions

Until the seventh special session, the resolutions of the General Assembly were identified by an arabic numeral followed, in parentheses, by the letter "S" and a roman numeral indicating the session (for example: resolution 3362 (S-VII)). The decisions were not numbered.

Since the eighth special session, resolutions and decisions have been identified by the letter "S" and an arabic numeral indicating the session, followed by an oblique stroke and another arabic numeral (for example: resolution S-8/1, decision S-8/11).

### **Emergency special sessions**

Until the fifth emergency special session, the resolutions of the General Assembly were identified by an arabic numeral followed, in parentheses, by the letters "ES" and a roman numeral indicating the session (for example: resolution 2252 (ES-V)). The decisions were not numbered.

Since the sixth emergency special session, resolutions and decisions have been identified by the letters "ES" and an arabic numeral indicating the session, followed by an oblique stroke and another arabic numeral (for example: resolution ES-6/1, decision ES-6/11).

In each of the series described above, the numbering follows the order of adoption.

The present volume contains the decisions adopted by the General Assembly from 14 September to 24 December 2010. Resolutions adopted by the Assembly during that period appear in volume I, together with information on the allocation of agenda items. Resolutions and decisions adopted subsequently during the sixty-fifth session will be published in volume III.

### A. Elections and appointments

#### 65/401. Appointment of the members of the Credentials Committee

At its 26th plenary meeting, on 5 October 2010, the General Assembly, in accordance with rule 28 of its rules of procedure, appointed a Credentials Committee for its sixty-fifth session consisting of the following Member States: Bahamas, China, Finland, Gabon, Guatemala, Kenya, Russian Federation, Singapore and United States of America.

#### 65/402. Election of five non-permanent members of the Security Council

At its 28th plenary meeting, on 12 October 2010, the General Assembly, in accordance with Article 23 of the Charter of the United Nations and rule 142 of the rules of procedure of the Assembly, elected COLOMBIA, GERMANY, INDIA, PORTUGAL and SOUTH AFRICA as non-permanent members of the Security Council for a two-year term of office beginning on 1 January 2011 to fill the vacancies occurring on the expiration of the terms of office of AUSTRIA, JAPAN, MEXICO, TURKEY and UGANDA.

At its 35th plenary meeting, on 25 October 2010, the General Assembly, in accordance with rule 140 of the rules of procedure of the Assembly, elected SPAIN and SWITZERLAND as members of the Economic and Social Council for the remainder of the terms of office of TURKEY and LIECHTENSTEIN, respectively, beginning on 1 January 2011.

At the same meeting, the General Assembly, in accordance with Article 61 of the Charter of the United Nations and rule 145 of the rules of procedure of the Assembly, elected Australia, Cameroon, China, Ecuador, Finland, Gabon, Hungary, Latvia, Malawi, Mexico, Nicaragua, Norway, Pakistan, Qatar, the Republic of Korea, the Russian Federation, Senegal and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland as members of the Economic and Social Council for a three-year term of office beginning on 1 January 2011 to fill the vacancies occurring on the expiration of the terms of office of Australia, Brazil, Cameroon, China, the Congo, Finland, Malaysia, Mozambique, the Niger, Norway, Pakistan, Poland, the Republic of Korea, the Republic of Moldova, the Russian Federation, Saint Lucia, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and Uruguay.

At its 47th plenary meeting, on 9 November 2010, the General Assembly, on the basis of nominations by the Economic and Social Council<sup>2</sup> and in accordance with the annex to Council resolution 2008 (LX) of 14 May 1976, paragraph 1 of Council resolution 1987/94 of 4 December 1987, as well as Assembly decision 42/450 of 17 December 1987, elected ALGERIA, ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA, BENIN, CHINA, ERITREA and the REPUBLIC OF KOREA as members of the Committee for Programme and Coordination for a three-year term of office beginning on 1 January 2011 to fill six of the seven vacancies occurring on the expiration of the terms of office of BANGLADESH, CHINA, JAMAICA, KENYA, the LIBYAN ARAB JAMAHIRIYA, the NIGER and the REPUBLIC OF KOREA.

  - (iii) Further decided to explore possibilities for rationalizing debates on individual agenda items, including, as encouraged in its resolution 59/313, through more interactive and dynamic debates with a view to contributing to intergovernmental decision-making;
  - (e) With regard to draft resolutions submitted to the Second Committee:
  - (i) Reaffirmed the sovereign right of Member States to submit proposals in accordance with the rules of procedure of the General Assembly;

### 65/513. Administration of justice at the United Nations

At its 57th plenary meeting, on 6 December 2010, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the Sixth Committee, <sup>108</sup> decided that the consideration of the outstanding legal aspects of the item entitled "Administration of justice at the United Nations", including the question of effective remedies for non-staff personnel, as well as the code of conduct for the judges of the United Nations Dispute Tribunal and the United Nations Appeals Tribunal, would be continued during its sixty-sixth session in the framework of a working group of the Sixth Committee, taking into account the results of the deliberations of the Fifth and Sixth Committees on the item, previous decisions of the Assembly and any further decisions that the Assembly may take during its sixty-fifth session. The Assembly also decided to include in the provisional agenda of its sixty-sixth session the item entitled "Administration of justice at the United Nations".
