

Appointments to fill vacancies in subsidiary organs and other appointments

Appointment of members and alternate members of the United Nations Staff Pension Committee

Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. The Secretary-General has received notification of the resignation of Andrei Vitalievitch Kovalenko (Russian Federation) from the United Nations Staff Pension Committee, with effect from 19 September 2011. Accordingly, the General Assembly will be required to appoint, at its current session, a person to fill the vacancy for the remaining period of the term of office of Mr. Kovalenko, which expires on 31 December 2012.
- 2. The Government of the Russian Federation has nominated Dmitry S. Chumakov to fill the vacancy arising from the resignation of Mr. Kovalenko.
- 3. In a communication dated 27 October 2011, the Secretariat was informed by the Chair of the Group of Eastern European States that the candidature of Mr. Chumakov had been endorsed by the Group.
