Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. The Secretary-General has received notification of the resignation of Jun Yamada (Japan) from the United Nations Staff Pension Committee, with effect from 10 May 2012. Accordingly, the General Assembly will be required to appoint, at its current session, a person to fill the vacancy for the remaining period of the term of office of Mr. Yamada, which expires on 31 December 2012.
- 2. The Government of Japan has nominated Hitoshi Kozaki to fill the vacancy arising from the resignation of Mr. Yamada.
- 3. In a communication dated 25 May 2012, the Secretariat was informed by the Chair of the Group of Asia-Pacific States that the candidature of Mr. Kozaki had been endorsed by the Group.
