Note by the Secretary-General

Addendum

1. The Secretary-General has received notification of the resignations of Sun Xudong (China), with effect from 15 April 2014, and Thomas David Smith (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland), with effect from 14 April 2014, from the Committee on Contributions.
2. Accordingly, the General Assembly will be required to appoint, at its current session, two persons to fill the vacancies for the remaining period of the terms of office of Mr. Sun and Mr. Smith, both of which expire on 31 December 2014.
3. The Government of China has nominated Fu Daopeng to fill the vacancy arising from the resignation of Mr. Sun.
4. In a communication dated 23 April 2014, the Secretariat was informed by the Chair of the Group of Asia-Pacific States that the candidature of Mr. Fu had been endorsed by the Group.
5. The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland has nominated Kunal Khatri to fill the vacancy arising from the resignation of Mr. Smith.
6. In a communication dated 22 April 2014, the Secretariat was informed by the Chair of the Group of Western European and other States that the candidature of Mr. Khatri had been endorsed by the Group.
