Appointments to fill vacancies in subsidiary organs and other appointments: appointment of members of the Independent Audit Advisory Committee**Report of the Fifth Committee***Rapporteur:* Mr. Matthias **Dettling** (Switzerland)

1. At its 2nd plenary meeting, on 19 September 2014, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include in the agenda of its sixty-ninth session the item entitled “Appointments to fill vacancies in subsidiary organs and other appointments: appointment of members of the Independent Audit Advisory Committee” and to allocate it to the Fifth Committee.

2. At its 11th meeting, on 7 November 2014, the Fifth Committee had before it the following documents:

(a) Note by the Secretary-General concerning the vacancies in the membership of the Independent Audit Advisory Committee that would occur as a result of the expiration of the term of office of two of its members on 31 December 2014 ([A/69/105](#));

(b) Note by the Secretary-General containing the names of two persons nominated by their respective Governments for appointment or reappointment to the Independent Audit Advisory Committee for a three-year term of office¹ beginning on 1 January 2015 ([A/C.5/69/9](#)).

3. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, by acclamation, to recommend to the General Assembly that it appoint J. Christopher Mihm (United States of America) and Richard Quartey Quartey (Ghana) as members of the Independent Audit Advisory Committee for a three-year term of office beginning on 1 January 2015 (see para. 4).

¹ Members shall serve for three years and can be re-elected for a second and final term of three years.



Recommendation of the Fifth Committee

4. The Fifth Committee recommends that the General Assembly appoint J. Christopher Mihm (United States of America) and Richard Quartei Quartey (Ghana) as members of the Independent Audit Advisory Committee for a three-year term of office beginning on 1 January 2015.
