### Proposed programme budget for the biennium 2016-2017

## Review of the experience of the utilization of the contingency fund

### Eighth report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions on the proposed programme budget for the biennium 2016-2017

1. The Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions has considered the report of the Secretary-General on the review of the experience of the utilization of the contingency fund ([A/70/395](#)). During its consideration of the report, the Committee met representatives of the Secretary-General, who provided additional information and clarification, concluding with written responses received on 22 October 2015.

2. In its resolution 41/213, the General Assembly created the contingency fund, stipulating in annex I to the resolution that, in off-budget years, the Secretary-General must submit an outline of the programme budget for the following biennium, which must contain an indication of, inter alia, the size of the fund expressed as a percentage of the overall level of resources. No set percentage was specified (*ibid.*, para. 4). The criteria for the use of the fund, the period covered and its operation are set out in the annex to resolution 42/211 (*ibid.*, para. 5). The report of the Secretary-General is submitted pursuant to section XII of resolution 69/262, by which the Assembly requested the Secretary-General to review the recent experience of the utilization of the fund in all its relevant aspects and to report thereon at the seventieth session.

3. As indicated by the Secretary-General in section III of his report, the General Assembly set the size of the fund for the biennium 1990-1991 at 0.75 per cent of the preliminary estimate for the biennium (\$15 million). The percentage applied has since remained unchanged, while the actual nominal level has varied with the size of the approved outline amount, rising to \$41.7 million for the biennium 2016-2017 (*ibid.*, fig. I). The Secretary-General also indicates that additional appropriations were approved outside the fund for the bienniums 2006-2007 (\$52.6 million), 2012-2013 (\$8.6 million) and 2014-2015 (\$5.1 million) (*ibid.*, table 1). In that connection, the Advisory Committee was provided, upon enquiry, with current information on



the charges against the fund approved for the biennium 2014-2015 and notes that the total charges amount to \$40.196 million, with an available balance of \$248,900<sup>1</sup> (see annex).

4. The four categories of reports approved by the General Assembly containing charges against the fund are set out in table 2 of the report of the Secretary-General and are as follows: programme budget implications; revised estimates for the Human Rights Council; revised estimates for the Economic and Social Council; and other revised estimates and supplementary programme budget requirements.

5. The Advisory Committee was informed, upon enquiry, that the operation of the fund had not changed since its establishment and that, as stipulated in the annex to resolution 42/211, additional expenditure was covered as it related to the biennium, based on the decisions taken in the year preceding the biennium and during the biennium. The Committee was provided with information on those charges against the fund approved in the year preceding the budget period, which is reflected in the table.

Upon enquiry, the Advisory Committee was informed that, in preparing the proposed programme budget for a given biennium, the Secretary-General endeavoured to include all requirements envisaged for that biennium and did not exclude amounts that would later represent a charge against the fund. The Committee was also informed that that was in line with a prior recommendation by the Committee, in which it had expressed its view that it was the responsibility of the Secretary-General, as chief administrative officer of the Organization, to ensure that his proposed programme budget presented the fullest possible picture of the Organization's requirements for the coming biennium.

7. The Advisory Committee notes from the table that the percentage of charges against the fund approved in the year preceding the budget period has fluctuated considerably in recent bienniums, showing an uneven trend that may, in the view of the Committee, indicate that resource needs have not always been presented comprehensively in the budgets proposed by the Secretary-General.

**8. The Advisory Committee reiterates its previous recommendation that, while recognizing that additional resource requirements must be considered and that it is not always possible to fit new initiatives within the biennial cycle of the regular budget, it is the responsibility of the Secretary-General, as chief administrative officer of the Organization, to ensure that the proposed**

**programme budget presents the fullest possible picture of the Organization's requirement for any given biennium. The Committee continues to stress that, at all times, every effort should be made to incorporate additional requirements into the initial budget proposals (see also [A/68/7/Add.22](#), para. 6).**

9. The Advisory Committee was informed, upon enquiry, that, in addition to the fund, several other funding mechanisms provided the Secretary-General with flexibility in the use of resources: authorization to enter into commitments to meet unforeseen and extraordinary expenses; transfers between programme budget appropriations; authorization to enter into commitments for future financial periods; establishment of extrabudgetary posts funded at the level of D-1 and above; and limited budgetary discretion of up to \$20 million per biennium on an experimental basis. Further details in this respect are included in the Committee's report on the limited budgetary discretion mechanism (see [A/70/7/Add.5](#), annex).

10. **The Advisory Committee also recalls its view that the contingency fund is an essential budgetary instrument for addressing additional resource requirements and emphasizes the need to adhere to the provisions of General Assembly resolutions 41/213 and 42/211 on its use. The Committee continues to stress that, in the event of constraints being faced, the Secretary-General should bring these matters to the attention of the Assembly in a timely manner (see also [A/68/7/Add.22](#), para. 7).**

11. **The Advisory Committee recommends that the General Assembly take note of the report of the Secretary-General, taking into consideration the foregoing comments.**
