Information from Non-Self-Governing Territories transmitted under Article 73 *e* of the Charter of the United Nations

Report of the Secretary-General

Summary

The present report, mandated by the General Assembly in its resolution [72/91](#), pertains to the transmittal of information from the administering Powers called for under Article 73 *e* of the Charter of the United Nations.



1. Under the terms of Article 73 *e* of the Charter of the United Nations, States Members of the United Nations that have or assume responsibilities for the administration of Territories whose peoples have not yet attained a full measure of self-government undertake to transmit regularly to the Secretary-General information relating to the economic, social and educational conditions in the Territories for which they are respectively responsible, other than those Territories to which Chapters XII and XIII apply. In addition, the General Assembly, in several resolutions, the most recent of which was resolution [72/91](#), has requested the administering Powers concerned to transmit or continue to transmit to the Secretary-General the information prescribed in Article 73 *e* of the Charter, as well as the fullest possible information on political and constitutional developments in the Territories concerned.
2. The table annexed to the present report provides the dates on which information called for under Article 73 *e* of the Charter was transmitted to the Secretary-General for 2017, with 2016 data provided for reference purposes.
3. The information transmitted under Article 73 *e* of the Charter generally follows the standard form approved by the General Assembly and includes information on geography, history and population and economic, social and educational conditions. The annual reports of the Territories also include information on constitutional matters, as appropriate.
4. In compliance with the provisions of paragraph 5 of General Assembly resolution 1970 (XVIII) of 16 December 1963 and other relevant resolutions of the Assembly, including, in particular, resolution [66/82](#), the Secretariat has continued to use the information transmitted in the preparation of working papers on each Territory for the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples. The Special Committee has taken this information into account in formulating its decisions on these Territories, which are set out in the relevant chapters of its report to the Assembly ([A/72/23](#)). The report also contains an account of the action taken by the Special Committee in the implementation of resolution 1970 (XVIII) (see [A/72/23](#), chap. V).
5. It is recommended that the information received from the administering Powers on the Non-Self-Governing Territories be used in the preparation of the working papers of the Secretariat and discussed by the Special Committee at its annual session.

^d On 26 February 1976, the Permanent Representative of Spain to the United Nations informed the Secretary General that “the Spanish Government, as of today, definitely terminates its presence in the Territory of the Sahara and deems it necessary to place the following on record: ...
