

Confirmation of the appointment of members of the Investments Committee

Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. As indicated in document A/68/103, it will be necessary for the General Assembly, during its current session, to confirm the appointment by the Secretary-General of four persons to fill vacancies in the Investments Committee resulting from the expiration, on 31 December 2013, of the terms of office of Emilio J. Cárdenas (Argentina), Simon Jiang (China), Achim Kassow (Germany) and William J. McDonough (United States of America).
- 2. In accordance with the provisions of article 20 of the Regulations of the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund, the Secretary-General, after consultation with the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Board and the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, submits for confirmation by the General Assembly the reappointment of Mr. Jiang and Mr. Kassow as regular members of the Investments Committee for three-year terms of office, as well as the appointment of Ivan Pictet (Switzerland) and Michael Klein (United States of America) as regular members for one-year terms of office, beginning on 1 January 2014.
- 3. In accordance with past practice, the Secretary-General proposes that Gumersindo Oliveros (Spain), who has served since 2013, be reappointed as an ad hoc member of the Investments Committee for a one-year term, beginning on 1 January 2014.
