### Annotations

#### 1. Election of officers

The Ad Hoc Open-ended Intergovernmental Group of Experts on Energy and Sustainable Development may wish to elect a Bureau consisting of five members, one from each of the five regional groups of the United Nations, including two Co-Chairmen, one from a developed country and one from a developing country (Economic and Social Council resolution 1999/60).

Recalling its resolution 1999/60 of 30 July 1999 on preparations for the ninth session of the Commission on Sustainable Development, on energy issues, and bearing in mind the specific nature and purposes of the Group of Experts, which will meet in conjunction with the inter-sessional ad hoc working groups of the Commission at its eighth and ninth sessions, in 2000 and 2001, the Council decided, on the basis of rule 24, paragraph 1 (c), of its rules of procedure, that States that were not members of the Commission would be allowed to nominate their nationals to the Bureau of the Group (Council decision 1999/285).

**2. Adoption of the agenda and other organizational matters**

In accordance with rule 7 of the rules of procedures of the functional commissions of the Council, which also apply, insofar as they are practicable, to the proceedings of its subsidiary organs, at the beginning of each session the Group of Experts shall adopt the agenda for that session.

**3. Preparations for the ninth session of the Commission on Sustainable Development, on energy issues**

At its nineteenth special session, the General Assembly adopted the Programme for the Further Implementation of Agenda 21 (General Assembly resolution S-19/2, annex), which included the multi-year programme of work for the Commission on Sustainable Development, 1998-2002, under which the sectoral theme of the ninth session of the Commission will be atmosphere/energy and the topic for the economic sector of the session will be energy/transport. The General Assembly further stated that preparations for the ninth session of the Commission should be initiated at the seventh session of the Commission, and should utilize an open-ended intergovernmental group of experts on energy and sustainable development, to be convened in conjunction with inter-sessional meetings of the eighth and ninth sessions of the Commission. Pertinent decisions of the General Assembly are contained in the Programme for the Further Implementation of Agenda 21 (see General Assembly resolution S-19/2, annex, chap. III.B, paras. 42-56).

Furthermore, at its nineteenth special session, the General Assembly recognized the complexities and interdependencies inherent in addressing energy issues within the context of sustainable development, and underscored that in line with the objectives of Agenda 21, the ninth session of the Commission should contribute to a sustainable energy future for all.

Pursuant to Council resolution 1999/60 and decision 1999/285, the first session of the Ad Hoc Intergovernmental Group of Experts on Energy and Sustainable Development will be held from 6 to 10 March 2000. Furthermore, in its resolution 1999/60, the Council called upon Governments to actively participate and contribute to the preparatory process, and encouraged the participation in the preparatory process of civil society and other major groups, including the private sector, particularly from developing countries.
