CHAPTER V

COMMUNICATIONS CONCERNING HUMAN RIGHTS

1. The Commission on Human Rights decided to request the Secretary-General:
 - (a) to compile a confidential list of communications received concerning human rights before each session of the Commission;
 - (b) to communicate this confidential list to the Members of the Commission;
 - (c) to enable the Members of the Commission, upon request, to consult the originals of those communications;
 - (d) to inform the writers of all communications concerning human rights, however addressed, that their communications will be brought to the attention of the Commission on Human Rights.
2. The Commission on Human Rights, while recognizing that it has no power to take any action in regard to any complaints regarding human rights, decided that in the future, the Chairman or Vice-Chairman should meet, shortly before each session of the Commission, with one or two co-opted members for the purpose of receiving communications concerning human rights and bringing to the attention of the Commission such communications as may assist it in its work.
