Towards improved emergency responses: synthesis of UNICEF evaluations of humanitarian action 2010–2016

In recent years, UNICEF has worked hard to improve the support and services it provides to children and communities affected by emergencies. An analysis by the Evaluation Office of 30 humanitarian evaluations undertaken by UNICEF from 2010 to 2016 revealed that the organization has learned from experience and adapted its approach to become faster and more effective, while contributing to the wider reform of the humanitarian system. Important results have been achieved for children, while several areas of weakness remain. The evaluation recommendations are aimed at supporting further improvements in the organization's approach and performance at a time when the world faces immense humanitarian challenges.
