LETTER DATED 4 JUNE 1992 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE
OF BAHRAIN TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE
PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

In my capacity as Chairman of the Arab Group for the month of June, I have the honour to inform you that the Arab Group today held a discussion on the grave developments in the occupied Palestinian territory, including Jerusalam, in particular the critical situation in the Gaza Strip and the negative impact that the continuation of these repressive acts will have on the current peace process.

The members of the Arab Group asked me to convey to you their extreme concern about and their condemnation of the continuing Israeli practices against the Palestinian people in the occupied Palestinian territory.

The Arab Group wishes to draw the attention of the Security Council to the Israeli occupation authorities' escalation of their repressive acts against the Palestinian people, particularly in recent days, in violation of the obligations incumbent on them under the fourth Geneva Convention of 1949.

In this regard, the Arab Group affirms the responsibility of the Security Council, in particular with regard to the implementation of its pertinent resolutions, especially Security Council resolution 681 (1990).

The Arab Group hopes that the Security Council and the Secretary-General of the United Nations will take immediate action, in accordance with resolution 681 (1990) and other pertinent resolutions of the United Nations, to extend international protection to the Palestinian people under the yoke of Israeli occupation.

The Arab Group will follow the Security Council's efforts to exercise its responsibility and to put an end to Israeli violations.
