

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs, in follow-up to the resolutions of the Security Council, has transmitted the provisions of the resolutions to all ministries and relevant Government actors and private institutions so that they are able to take appropriate measures in accordance with established procedure.

The Government of the Republic of Rwanda would like to state that the country does not hold any diplomatic and consular relations with the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and therefore does not have any diplomats or representatives of the Government of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea within the country.
