**Organization of the Twenty-eighth Meeting of

and the Caribbean****Note by the Secretariat**

1. Representatives whose Governments wish to act as host for the Twenty-eighth or a subsequent meeting of Heads of National Drug Law Enforcement Agencies, Latin America and the Caribbean, are invited to inform the Twenty-seventh Meeting accordingly. That information will be brought to the attention of the Commission on Narcotic Drugs at its sixty-first session, in 2018.
2. The draft provisional agenda for the Twenty-eighth Meeting is annexed to the present note.
3. Item 4 of the draft provisional agenda will be devoted to the examination of the status of implementation of the recommendations adopted at the Twenty-seventh Meeting. In order to facilitate reporting, a questionnaire concerning action taken by Governments to implement those recommendations will be transmitted together with the invitation to attend the Twenty-eighth Meeting.
4. At the fortieth session of the Commission on Narcotic Drugs, the view was expressed that the recommendations adopted by the meetings of the subsidiary bodies of the Commission would remain meaningless if Governments did not take action, including, where necessary, the enactment of national legislation, to implement those recommendations. States represented at the Meeting of Heads of National Drug Law Enforcement Agencies, Latin America and the Caribbean, are urged to implement such recommendations conscientiously and promptly so that an effective evaluation of their progress can be made.
5. It would be desirable for the Twenty-seventh Meeting to identify the topics that would be most appropriate for consideration by working groups at the

Twenty-eighth Meeting. Alternatively, the Meeting may wish to request the Secretariat to consult States members informally with a view to identifying topics for consideration by the working groups.

6. In its resolution [56/10](#), the Commission on Narcotic Drugs requested the meetings of the subsidiary bodies of the Commission to contribute to the monitoring of the implementation by Member States of the Political Declaration and Plan of Action on International Cooperation towards an Integrated and Balanced Strategy to Counter the World Drug Problem at the regional level.

7. In the same resolution, the Commission encouraged Member States to consider the expertise and composition of their delegations to the meetings of its subsidiary bodies, with a view to covering the various aspects of the world drug problem (demand, supply and international cooperation) in order to hold substantive discussions on the issue.

8. The General Assembly held a special session on the world drug problem from 19 to 21 April 2016 and adopted an outcome document entitled “Our joint commitment to effectively addressing and countering the world drug problem” (General Assembly resolution S-30/1, annex). The outcome document contains a broad range of operational recommendations, covering seven thematic areas. Member States resolved to take the steps necessary to implement the operational recommendations, in close partnership with the United Nations and other intergovernmental organizations and civil society, and to share with the Commission on Narcotic Drugs, as the policymaking body of the United Nations with prime responsibility for drug control matters, timely information on progress made in the implementation of those recommendations. At the Twenty-eighth Meeting, participants will have the opportunity to discuss national and regional issues pertaining to the world drug problem, drawing on the outcome of the special session.

9. The Commission on Narcotic Drugs decided, at its sixtieth session, in March 2017, to convene a ministerial segment during its sixty-second session, to be held in Vienna in 2019, to take stock of the implementation of the commitments made to jointly address and counter the world drug problem, in particular in the light of the 2019 target date of the Political Declaration. At the Twenty-eighth Meeting, participants will have the opportunity to discuss the follow-up to the Political Declaration and Plan of Action and to the special session of the General Assembly on the world drug problem held in 2016, taking into consideration also the ministerial segment to be held during the sixty-second session of the Commission on Narcotic Drugs.

10. The Twenty-eighth Meeting will also provide participants with an opportunity to address any action by the Commission further to its decision [60/1](#), which was taken in response to paragraph 97 of General Assembly resolution [71/211](#), in which the Assembly invited the Commission to examine how its subsidiary bodies could better contribute to the implementation of the outcome document of the special session of the General Assembly held in 2016.
