Addendum

Implementation of the recommendations adopted by the Twenty-fifth Meeting of Heads of National Drug Law Enforcement Agencies, Africa

- 1. At its 2nd meeting, on 18 September 2017, the Meeting considered item 4 of its agenda, entitled "Implementation of the recommendations adopted by the Twenty-fifth Meeting of Heads of National Drug Law Enforcement Agencies, Africa". The Meeting had before it a note prepared by the Secretariat (UNODC/HONLAF/27/4) on the basis of information provided by Governments in response to a questionnaire sent to all States participating in the Meeting of HONLEA, Africa. As of 3 August 2017, replies had been received from the Governments of Algeria, Burundi, Egypt, Ghana, Kenya, Madagascar, Nigeria, Senegal and Sierra Leone. After that date and prior to the Meeting, completed questionnaires and country reports had been submitted in written form by Côte d'Ivoire, Sudan and Zambia.
- 2. The Secretary made an introductory statement. During the discussion, statements were made by Zambia, Ghana, Morocco, Kenya, and Sudan.
- 3. The Meeting discussed action taken by Governments of countries in the region to implement the recommendations adopted by the Twenty-fifth Meeting and highlighted actions taken in relation to specific recommendations.
- 4. The representatives of Zambia, Morocco and Sudan informed the meeting about efforts made by their countries to implement the recommendations adopted by the Twenty-fifth Meeting of HONLEA, Africa. The representative of Ghana provided information to supplement the responses that had already been provided by his Government for inclusion in the report for consideration by the Meeting under this item. Reference was made to challenges in enhancing the impact of awareness-raising campaigns.
