Currently, 569 students from Western Sahara are studying in Cuba, of whom:

- 463 are studying to become mid-level or pre-university specialists
- 56 are studying medicine
- 27 are taking Ministry of Higher Education university-level courses (engineering and other disciplines)
- 20 are taking Ministry of Education courses in teaching
- 3 are studying sport (2 of them at the international school).
