Elections, nominations, confirmations and appointments

Election of eight members of the Programme Coordinating Board of the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS

Note by the Secretary-General

1. The Programme Coordinating Board of the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS) is composed of 22 members. In accordance with its decision 1995/223, the Economic and Social Council is to elect, from among States Members of the United Nations and observer States, eight members of the Programme Coordinating Board for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 2020 to fill the vacancies that will occur on 31 December 2019 upon the expiration of the terms of the following members: Algeria, Belarus, France, India, Indonesia, Madagascar, Mexico and United States of America.
2. The election will be held at the management meeting of the Council, on 7 May 2019.
3. The eight members are to be elected according to the following pattern:
 - (a) Two members from African States;
 - (b) Two members from Asia-Pacific States;
 - (c) One member from Eastern European States;
 - (d) One member from Latin American and Caribbean States;
 - (e) Two members from Western European and other States.
4. The membership of the Programme Coordinating Board in 2019 is listed in the annex to the present note.
