ANNEX

STATEMENT

OF THE VIETNAMESE FOREIGN MINISTRY' SPOKESMAN.

According to Western reports, the U.S. administration is urgently shipping military equipment to Thailand, including anti-aircraft missiles and long-range artillery, allegedly to help the Thai army resist the so-called "border attacks of Vietnamese forces".

This act of the United States takes place following repeated statements of the U.S. State Department during the past few days echoing the slanderous charge by the Thai authorities and China that Viet Nam has attacked Kampu-chean civilians and threatened Thailand's security.

The United States' stepped-up military aid to Thailand and its slanderous allegations are clearly aimed at helping Thailand to increase its military activities in support of the Pol Pot remnants and other Khmer reactionaries, thus posing a threat to Kampuchea's territory and peace and security in Southeast Asia. These acts take place alongside U.S. - Beijing coordination to bring about a confrontation between the two groups of the Indochinese and ASEAN countries and prevent the trend towards dialogue in the region. These acts of the U.S. only benefit Beijing expansionism and hegemonism.

The Foreign Ministry of the Socialist Republic of Viet Nam strongly condemns the United States for its increased military aid to Thailand and its continued collusion with China to oppose the Kampuchean people's revolution, thus rendering the situation along the Kampuchean - Thai border more tense. The U.S. Government must bear full responsibility for all possible consequences of its above-said acts.
