On 3 April, at 5.35 a.m. Moscow time, an underground nuclear explosion with a yield of from 20 to 150 kiloton8 was conducted in the Soviet Union at a test site in the region of Semipalatinsk.

The above-mentioned test was conducted with a view to improving military technology.
