The resolution of the Security Council, numbered in accordance with a system adopted in 1964, are published in yearly volumes of *Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council*. The new system, which has been applied retroactively to resolutions adopted before I January 1965, became fully operative on that date.

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INTRODUCTION

- The present report is submitted to the General Assembly by the Security Council in accordance with Article 24, paragraph 3, and Article 15, paragraph 1, of the Charter of the United Nations, It is the forty-third annual report of the Security Council to the Genc all Assembly. These reports are circulated as Supplement No. 2 to the Official Records of each regular session of the General Assembly,
- 2, As in previous years, the report is not intended as a substitute for the records of the Security Council, which constitute the only comprehensive and authoritative account of its deliberations, but as a guide to the activities of the Security Council during the period covered. It should be noted, in this connection, that is December 1974 the Council decided to make its report shorter and more concise, without changing its basic structure. Moreover, in 1985, the Council agreed, in keeping with the spirit of its 1974 decision, to discontinue the practice of summarising documents addressed to the President of the Council or to the Secretary-General and circulated as official documents of the Council and instead simply to indicate the subject-matter of those documents which related to the procedure of the Council, This report has been prepared in accordance with those decisions,
- 3. Chapters in part I are arranged in chronological order based on the first occasion on which the Council considered the item in a formal meeting during the period covered by the present report, Similarly, chapters in part IV are arranged in chronological order based on the date of the first communication on each item received during the same period.
- 4. With respect to the membership of the Security Council during the period covered, it will be recalled that the General Assembly, at the 40th plenary meeting of its forty-second session, on 15 October 1987, elected Algeria, Brazil, Nepal, Senegal and Yugoslavia as non-permanent members of the Council to fill the vacancies resulting from the expiration, on 31 December 1987, of the terms of office of Bulgaria, the Congo, Ghana, the United Arab Emirates and Venezuela.
- 5. The period covered in the present report is from 16 June 1987 to 15 June 1988, The Council held 67 meetings during that period.
- 6. One member of the Council is not in a position to agree to the Russian language version of this report for the reasons referred to in the first paragraph of chapter 23 (pare. 495) of the report of the Security Council to the General Assembly covering the period from 16 June 1976 to 15 June 1977.
- 7. Another member reaffirmed its position. In this respect as set out in chapter 23 (pare. 49%) of the report of the Security Council to the General Assembly covering the period from 16 June 1976 to 15 June 1977.

- B. Consideration at the 2750th meeting (20 July 1987)
- 34, At its 2750th meeting, on 20 July, the Security Council included the following item in its agenda without objection:

"The situation between Iran and Iraq".

- 35. The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Iraq, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote, in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter of the United Nations and rule 37 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure.
- 36. The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (\$/18983) which had been prepared in the course of the Council's consultations.
- 37. The Council then commenced its voting procedure.

- 38. Statements before the vote wore made by the representative of China, the Minister of State for Foreign Affairs of the United Arab Emirates, the Secretary of State for Foreign and Commonwealth Affairs of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Secretary of State of the United States of America, the Vice-Chancellor and Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Federal Republic of Qermany, the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Italy, the representatives of Qhana and Zambia, the Minister for Foreign Affairs and Worship of Argentina, the representative of the Congo and Venesuela and by the President in his capacity as the Minister for Foreign Affairs of France.
- 39, The Council thrn proceeded to the vote on the draft resolution,

Decision: At the 2750th meeting on 20 July 1987, the draft resolution (S/18983) was adopted unanimously as resolution 598 (1987).

40. Resolution 598 (1987) roads as follows:

"The Security Council,

"Reaffirming its resolution 582 (1986),

"Deeply concerned that, despite its calls for a cease-fire, the conflict between the Islamic Republic of Iran and Iraq continues unabated, with further heavy loos of human life and material destruction,

"Deploring the initiation and continuation of the conflict,

"Deploring also the bombing of purrly civilian population centres, attacks on neutral shipping or civilian aircraft, the violation of international humanitarian law and other laws of armed conflict, and, in particular, the use of chemical weapons contrary to obligations under thr 1925 Geneva Protocol, 1/

"Deeply concerned that further escalation and widening of the aonfliat may take place,

"Determined to bring to an end all military actions between Iran and Iraq,

"Convinced that a comprehensive, just, honourable and durable settlement should be achieved between Iran and Iraq.

"Recalling the provisions of the Charter of the United Nations, and in particular the obligation of all Member States to settle their international disputes by peaceful means in such a manner that international geace and security and justice are not endangered,

"Determining that there exists a breach of the peace as regards the conflict between Iran and Iraq,

- "Acting under Articles 39 and 40 of the Charter,
- "1. Demands that, as a first step towards a negotiated settlement, the Islamic Republic of Iran and Iraq observe an immediate cease-fire, discontinue all military actions on land, at sea and in the air, and withdraw all forcer to the internationally recognised boundaries without delay;
- "2. Requests the Secretary-General to dispatch a team of United Nations observers to verify, confirm and supervise the cease-fire and withdrawal and further requests the Secretary-General to make the necessary arrangement8 in conrultation with the parties and to submit a report thereon to the Security Council;
- "3. <u>Urges</u> that prisoners of war be released and repatriated without delay after the cessation of active hostilities in accordance with thr Third Geneva Convention of 12 August 1949; 2/
- "4. Calls upon Iran and Iraq to co-operate with the Secretary-General in implementing this resolution and in mediation efforts to achieve a comprehensive, just and honourable settlement, acceptable to both sides, of all outstanding issues, in accordance with the principles contained in the Charter of the United Nations;
- "5. Calls upon all other State8 to exercise the utmost restraint and to refrain from any act which may lead to further escalation and widening of the conflict, and thus to facilitate the implementation of the present resolution;
- "6. Requests the Secretary-General to explore, in conrultation with Iran and Iraq, the question of entrusting an impartial body with inquiring into responsibility for the conflict and to report to the Security Council as soon as possible;
- "7. Recognises the magnitude of the damage inflicted during thr conflict and the need for reconstruction efforts, with appropriate international assistance, once the conflict is ended and, in this regard, requests the Secretary-General to assign a team of experts to study the question of reconstruction and to report to the Security Council;
- "8. Further requests the Secretary-General to examine, in consultation with Iran and Iraq and with other States of the region, measure8 to enhance the security and stability of the region;
- "9. Requests the Secretary-General to keep the Security Council informed on the implementation of this resolution;
- "10. Decides to meet again as necessary to consider further steps to ensure compliance with this resolution.

"They express grave concern that resolution 598 (1987), which has a mandatory character, has not yet been implemented.

"The members of the Security Council take notr of the statement made by the Secretary-General to them on 14 March 1988. They encourage him to continue his efforts as endorred by the Security Council to secure implementation of resolution 598 (1987) and, in this connection, support his intention to invite the Governments of Iran and Iraq to send, at the earliest possible date, their foreign ministers, or another senior official, as a special mirrary to Now York to enter into urgent and intensive annultations with the Secretary-General. - "3. Expects both sides to refrain from the future use of chemical weapons in accordance with their obligations undar the Geneva Protocol;
- "4. Calls upon all States to continue to apply or to establish retrict control of the export to the parties to the conflict of chemical products serving for the production of chemical weaponer
- "5. <u>Decides</u> to remain seized of the matter, and exprender its determination to review the implementation of this resolution.

Reaffirms the urgent need to implement the provisions of the Security Council resolutions on Lebanon, in particular resolutions 425 (1978) and 426 (1978), and resolution 509 (1982), which demands that Israel withdraw all its military forces forthwith and unconditionally to the internationally recognized boundaries;

"They call once agair upon Bouth Africa to comply fully with Security Council resolutions 365 (1976) and 435 (1978) and to put an end to its illegal occupation and administration of Namibia."

- 527, The Council heard statements by the rrprearntativea of the United Republic of Tanzania, Zambia, Viet Nam, Argentina, Bulgaria, Venezuela, Ethiopia, Tunisia, Czechoslovakia and Portugal.

- 528. At its 2766th mesting, on 24 November, the Council continued its consideration of the item.
- 529. In addition to those previously invited, the President, with thr consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Colombia, Nigeria, Sao Tome and Principe and the Syrian Arab Republic, at their request, to participate in the diacuasion without the right to vote.
- 530. The President drew attention to a letter dated 24 November (\$/19293) from the representatives of the Congo, Qhana and Zambia requesting that an invitation under rulr 39 of the Council'8 provisional ruler of procedure be extended to Mr. Theo-Ben Gurirab, Secretary for Foreign Affairs of the South West Africa People's Organization (\$WAPO). In the absence of objection, the President extended the invitation requested.

- 534. At its 2767th mooting, on 25 November, the Council continued its consideration of the item, hoaring ◆⑤◆□○M■◆⑤ by the roproaentative of the Union of Soviet Socialist Ropublica, the United Arab Emiratea and by the President, speaking in his capacity as the representative of Japan.
- 535. Statements in xorciao of the right of reply were made by the representatives of Cuba and the United States of America.

"Gravely concerned also that the purauanco of these acts of aggroaaion against Angola constitutes a serious threat to international peace and security.

"Indignant at the illaqual entry into Angola by the head of the racist South African régime and some of his Ministera,

"Conscious of the urgent need to take immediate and effective steps for the prevention and removal of al!. threats to international péace and security poace by South Africa's acts of aggraaaion,

- "1. Strongly condemns the racist régime of South Africa for its continued and intensified acts of aggression against the Paopls'a Republic of Angola, as well as its continuing occupation of parts of that State, which constitute a flagrant violation of the advorcionty and territorial integrity of Angola)
- "2. Strongly condemns the illegal entry into Angola by the head of the racist South African régime and some of his Ministers, in flagrant violation of Angola's territorial integrity and sovereignty;
- "3. Strongly condemns South Africa for its utilization of the Territory of Namibia ad a apringboard for acts of aggression and destabilisation of Angola;
- "4, <u>Demands once again</u> that South Africa cease immediately its acts of aggression against Angola and unconditionally withdraw all its forces occupying Angolan territory, as well as scrupulously respect the sovereignty, airspace, territorial integrity and independence of Angola;
- "5. Decides to mandate the Secretary-General to monitor the withdrawal of the South African military forces from the territory of Angole and to report to the Security Council on the implementation of the present resolution not later than 10 December 1987;

- "6. Calls upon all Member States to co-operate with the Secretary-General in the implementation of the present resolution and to ref rain from any action which would undermine the independence, terr 1 tori al integrity and adversignty of Angola;

 - "8. Decides to remain seized of the matter."

- "3. Reaffirms that the Geneva Convention relative to the Protection of Civilian Persons in Time of War, of 12 August 1949, is applicable to the Palestinian and other Arab territories occupied by Israel since 1967, including Jerusalem;
- "4. Calls once again upon Israel, the occupying Power, to abide immediately and scrupulously by the Geneva Convention relative to the Protection of Civilian Persons in Time of War, of 12 August 1949, and to desist forthwith from its policies and practice8 that are in violation of the provisions of the Convention;
- "5. Stresses the urgent nerd to reach a just, durable and peaceful settlement of the Arab-Israeli conflict, under the auspices of the United Nations:
- "6. Requests the Secretary-General to examine the present situation in the occupied Palestinian territory by all means available to him, including the appointment of a special representative for that purpose, as well as to submit a report no later than 20 January 1966 on measures necessary to ensure safety of and protection for the Palestinian civilians under Israeli occupation;
- "7, Decides to keep the eituation in the occupied Palestinian and other Arab terri tories under review."

- 607. The representative of thr PLO made a statement.
- 608. At its 2776th mooting, on 16 December, the Council continued its consideration of the item.
- 609. In addition to those previously invited, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Nicaragua, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.
- 610. Statements were made by the representatives of Nicaragua, the Federal Republic of Germany, the United Kingdom, Israel and the United Arab Emirates.
- 611. A statement war made by the representative of the PLO.
- 612, The President, speaking in hi8 capacity as the representative of the USSR, made a statement.
- 613. The mooting war suspended.
- 614, Upon the resumption of the mooting, the Premident made a statement.
- 615. At the 2777th meeting, on 22 December, the President drew attention to the revised trxt of the draft resolution (\$/19352/Rev.1) sponsored by Argentina, the Congo, Ghana, the United Arab Emirates and Zambia.
- 616. The Council continued its consideration of the item and heard a statement by the representative of Israel.
- 617. In accordance with the decision taken at the 2772nd meeting, a statement war made by Mr. Maksoud.
- 618. The Council then commenced it8 voting procedure on the revised draft resolution (S/19352/Rev.1) before it,
- 619. Before the vote, a statement was made by the representative of Japan.

Calls once again upon Israel, the occupying Power, to abide immediately and scrupulously by the Geneva Convention relative to the Protection of Civilian Persons in Time of War, of 12 August 1949, and to desist forthwith from its policies and practices that are in violation of the provisions of the Conventionr

- "5. Stresses the urgrnt need to roach a just, durable end peaceful settlement of the Arab-Israeli conflict)
- "6. Requests the Secretary-General to examine the present situation in the occupied territories by all means available to him, and to sumit a report no later than 20 January 1906 containing the recommendations on ways and means for ensuring the safety and protection of the Palestinian civilians under Israeli occupation;
- "7. Decides to keep the situation in the Palestinian and other Arab territories occupied by Israel since 1967, including Jerusalem, under review."

- 648. A statement was made by the representative of the PLO.

- "2. **Requests** that Israel desist forthwith from deporting any other Palestinian civilians from the occupied **territories**;
- "3. <u>Decides</u> to keep the situation in the Palestinian and other Arab territories occupied by Israel since 1967, including Jerusalem, under review."

- 660. A statement was made by the representative of the PLO.

The President informed the Council of a letter dated 14 April from the Acting Chairman of the Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People, requesting that an invitation under rule 39 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Council be extended to the Acting Chairman of that Committee. In the absence of objection, the President extended the invitation requested.

- 737. The representative of Nepal made a statement.
- 738. In accordance with the decision taken earlier at the meeting, the Council heard a statement by the Acting Chairman of the Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People.
- 739. Statements were also made by the representatives of Yugoslavia, Tunisia, Kuwait, Israel and Pakistan.
- 740. The representative of the PLO made a further statement.
- 741. At its 2806th meeting, on 15 April, the Council continued its consideration of the item.
- 742. In addition to those previously invited, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Bangladesh, at his request, to participate in the debate without the right to vote.
- 743. The President informed the Council of a letter dated 14 April (S/19773) from the representative of Jordan requesting that an invitation under rule 39 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council be extended to Mr. Engin A. Ansay, observer of OIC. In the absence of objection, the President extended the invitation requested.
- 744. The President drew attention to a letter dated 14 April (S/19776) from the representative of Algeria requesting that an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure be extended to Mr. Clovis Maksoud, observer of LAS. "Reaffirming its resolutions 605 (1987) of 22 December 1987, 607 (1988) of 5 January 1988 and 608 (1988) of 14 January 1988,

"Recalling the report of the Secretary-General of 21 January 1986 (8/19443),

"Having been apprised of the deportation by Israel, the occupying Power, of eight civilian Palestinians on 11 April 1988 and of its decision to continue the deportation of Palestinian civilian8 in the occupied territories,

"Gravely concerned and alarmed by the measures adopted by Israel against the civilian Palestinian people and its persistent policy of taking measures of collective punishment, such as th4 recent demolition of homes in thr vill490 of Beita.

"Also expressing grave concern over the action taken by the forces of the occupying Power 94in.t Sheikh Saad Eddin El-Alami, Head of the Supreme Islamic Council, who was 98eault.d and beaten in the Haram al-Shrrif in Jerusalem, on 1 April 1988,

"Reaffirming once again that the Geneva Convention relative to the Protection of Civilian Persons in Time of War, of 12 August 1949, 1/ is applicable to Palestinian and other Arab territories, occupied by Israel since 1967, including Jerusalem,

"Recalling in particular the provisions of article 49 of the Fourth Geneva Convention • d expressing alarm that Israel has continued to transfer its civilian population into the territory it occupies and has • quipped those settlers with arms which have boon used against the civilian Palestinian people.

- "1. Urgas Israel, the occupying Power, to abide immediately and scrupulously by the Geneva Convention relative to the Protection of Civilian Persons in Time of War, of 12 August 1949, end to desist forthwith from it8 policies and practices that are in violation of the provision8 of the Convention:
- "2. <u>Urgos further</u> Israel to rescind the order to deport Palestinian civilian8 and nburo the safe and immediate return to the occupied Palestinian territories of those already deported;
- "3. Urges once again Israel to desist forthwith Prom deporting Palestinian civilians from the occupied territories;

- "4. Condemns those policies and practices of Israel, the occupying Power, that violate the human rights of the Palestinian people in the occupied territories, and in particular the opening of fire by the Israeli army, resulting in the killing and wounding of defenceless Palestinian civilians:
- "5. Affirms the urgent need to achieve, under the auspices of the United Nations, a comprehensive, just and lasting settlement of the Arab/Israeli conflict, an integral part of which is the Palestinian problem, and expresses its determination to work towards that end;
- "6. Requests the Secretary-General to submit periodic reports on the situation in the occupied territories, including those aspects relating to endeavours for ensuring the safety and protection of the Palestinian civilians under Israeli occupation;
- "7. Decides to keep the situation in the Palestinian and other Arab **terri ories** occupied by Israel since 1967, including Jerusalem, under review."
- 746. The Council continued its consideration of the item and heard statements by the representatives of France, Argentina and Japan.
- 747. In accordance with the decisions taken earlier at the meeting, the Council heard statements by **Mr. Ansay** and by Mr. Maksoud.

United Kinadom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Yuaoslavia and Zambia), with 1 against (United States of America) and no abstentions, and was not adopted, owing to the negative vote of a permanent member of the Council.

- "3, (alls upon all the parties concerned to continue to co-operate with the Force on the basis of the present mandate.

"<u>Further concerned</u> at the South African racist régime's almost total censorship of the media, in particular its ban on the coverage of events in the black township,

"Qutraged at the banning/restriction on 23 February 1988 of seventeen democratic mass organizations and ightoen individuals, including Archie Gumede and Albertina Sirulu, all organizations and individuals committed to peaceful forms of struggle,

"Convinced that the banning/restriction of those democratic organisations and individuals, all committed to peaceful forms of struggle, undermines the possibilities of a peaceful resolution of the South African conflict,

"Convinced further that the violence and repression by the South African racist regime have quratly aggravated the rituation in South Africa and will inevitably load to violent conflict and racial conflagration with serious international repercussions,

"Convinced further that the Pretoria régime's intransigent refusal to co-operate with the international efforts in search of a peaceful solution to the escalating conflict in South Africa compens the international community to impose, as a first atop, selective mandatory ranctions under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations.

"Acting wider Chapter VII of the Charter in discharge of its responsibilities for the maintenance of international peace and security,

"Reiterating its condemnation of the <u>apartheid</u> policy and practices of the South African régime and South Africa's continued defiance of the relevant resolutions of the lited Nations as well as its designs to entrench further the <u>apartheid</u> system,

"Reaffirming that only the total eradication of spartheid and the establishment of a non-racial democratic society based on majority rule, through the full end free exercise of adult suffrage by all the people in a united and unfragmented South Africe, can lead to a just, equitable and lasting solution to the South African situation,

"Mindful of its responsibilities under the Charter for the maintenance of international peace and • ocurity:

"1. Condemns the continuing intensification of repression by thr South African racist régime such as the arbitrary mass arrest and detention, torture in dstrntion and murder of thr leaders and activ. sts of mass organisations, including children, the near-total mussling of the press, the maintenance end

- xprnaion of the state $\square \nearrow$ morqoncy and, in particular, the restriction of seventeen mass organisations and iqht.8 1 individuals committed to peaceful forms of struggle;
- "2. <u>Declares</u> that racist South Africa's intransigent refusal to comply with the relevant decisions of the Security Council end the resolutions of the General Assembly constitutes a direct challenge to the authority of the United Nation8 and a violation of the principles of the Charter of the United Nations;
- "3. <u>Determines</u> that the policies and practices of apartheid pursued by the Pretoria racist régime, which are the root cause of the grave and deteriorating situation in South Afric. and in southern Africa as a whole, constitute a orious throat to international peace end security;
- "4| Decidus, under Chapter VII of thr Chartrr end in conformity with it8 responsibility for the maintenance of international peace and security, to impose the following mandatory sanctions against South Africa, in accordance with Article 411
- "(a) Cossation of further investment in, and financial loans to, South Africa;
 - "(b) Ban on the importation of iron and steel;
 - "(c) An rnd to all promotion of and oupport for trade with South Africa;
- "(d) Prohibition of the sale of kruggeranda and all other coins minted in South Africa;
- "(e) Cessation of all forma of military, police or intelligence co-operation with the authorities of South Africe, in particular the sale of computer quipmontr
 - "(f) Cossation of the export and sale of oil to South Africa;
- "5. Calls upon all Member States, in conformity with Article 25 of the Charter, to implement the present resolution;
- "6. Requests the specialised agencies to ensure the effective implementation of the present resolution;
- "7. Urges States not members of the United Nations to act in accordance with the provision8 of the present resolution;
- "8. <u>Decides</u> to establish, in accordance with rule 28 of its provisional ruler of procedure, a Committee of the Security Council to monitor the implementation of the present resolution;
- "9. Calls upon all States to report to the Secretary-General of the United Nation8 on measures taken to implement the present resolution;
- "10 <u>recides</u> that these measures shall, in the first instance, remain in force for a period of twelve months, after which the Security Council shall meet again to determine whether the South African régime has fully mot the following requirements:

- "(a) Abolished apartheid;

"Gravely concerned at the deteriorating situation in South Africa, the worsening human suffering resulting from the apartheid system and, inter alia, the South African regime's renewed state of morgoncy, its imposition of severe restrictions on iphtoon anti-apartheid and labour organizations and ightoon individuals committed to peaceful forms of struggle on 24 February 1988 and the harassment and detention of church leaders on 29 February 1988, all of which further undermine the possibilities of a peaceful resolution of the South African situation,

"Having considered the question of the death sentences passed on 12 December 1985 in South Africa on Mojalefa Reginald Sefatsa, Reid Malebo Mokoena, Oupa Moses Diniso, Theresa Ramashanola, Duma Joseph Khumrlo and Francis Don Mokhri, known as the Sharpeville Six, as well as the decision to execute there on Friday, 18 March 1988,

"Conscious that the Court proceedings of the Sharpeville Six show that none of the six young South Africans convicted of murder wax found by the Court to have caused the actual death of the Councillor and that they were convicted of murder and sentenced to death only because the Court found that they had a "common purpose" with thr actual perpetrators,

"Deeply concerned at the Pretoria régime's decision to • xcrcuto the Sharpeville Six on Friday, 16 March 1988, in defiance of world-wide appeals.

"Convinced that these executions, if carried out, will further inflame an already grave situation in South Africa,

- "1. Calls upon the South African authorities to stay xocution and commute the doath sentences imposed on the Sharpeville Six;
- "2. Urges all States and organisations to use their influence and take urgent measures, in conformity with the Charter of the United Nations, the resolutions of the Security Council nd relevant international instruments, to save the lives of the Sharpeville Six."

"Letter dated 19 April 1988 from the Permanent Representative of Tunisia to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/19798)".

1006. The President, with the consent of the Council, invited thr representatives of Egypt, Gabon, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Morocco, Mozambique, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, Somalia, the Syrian Arab Republic and Tunisia, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote, in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter of the United Nations and rule 37 of the Council's provisional rulra of procedure.

1007. The President informed the Council of a letter dated 21 April (8/19814) from the representative of Algeria requesting that an invitation be • xtondod to the observer of the Palestine Liberation Organization (PLO) to participate in the debate on the item in accordance with the Council's part practice. He added that the proposal was not made pursuant to rule 37 or 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure but that, if approved by the Council, the invitation would confer on the PLO the rams rights of participation as those conferred on a Member State when it was invited to participate pursuant to rule 37.

1006. The representative of the United States of America made a statement concerning the proposal,

Decision: At the 2807th meeting, on 21 April 1988, the proposal was adopted by 10 votes in favour (Algeria, Argentina, Brazil, China, Japan, Nepal, Senegal, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, Yugoslavia and Zambia) to 1 against (United States of America), with 4 abstentions (France, Germany, Federal Republic of, Italy and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland).

- 1009, The President drew attention to another letter from the representative of Algeria dated 20 April (S/19815), requesting that an invitation under rule 39 of the Council'8 provisional ruler of procedure be extended to Mr, Clovis Makroud, observer of the League of Arab State8 (LAS) to the United Nations. In the absence of objection, the Council extended the invitation requested.
- 1010, The Council then began its consideration of the item by hearing a statement by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Tunisia.
- 1011, The representative of the PLO made a atatement.

- 1015, The Council heard statements by the representative of Italy, China, the USSR, Yugoslavia, Japan, Argentina and Brazil.
- 1016, In accordance with the decision taken earlier in the meeting, the Council heard a reatment by Mr. Maksoud.
- 1017, Statements were also made by the representative of Somalia, Kuwait, Pakistan, Lebanon and Saudi Arabia,
- 1018. At it8 2809th meeting, on 22 April, the Council continued it8 consideration of the item.
- 1019, In addition to those previously invited, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Bahrain, Greece, the Lao Prople's Democratic Republic, the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, the Sudan and Zimbabwe, at their request, to participate in the debate without the right to vote.
- 1020, The **President** drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/19819) submitted by Algeria, Argentina, Nepal, Senegal, Yugoslavia and Zambia.
- 1021. The Council heard statements by the representative of Morocco, Qatar, Nepal, Bangladesh, the Federal Republic of Germany, Mozambique, Egypt, Cabon, the Ukrainian SSR, the United Arab Emirates, Yemen, Turkey, the Lao People's Democratic Republic, Greece, Zimbabwe, Bahrain and the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya.
- 1022. At it8 2810th meeting, on 25 April, the Council resumed its consideration of the item.
- 1023, In addition to those previously invited, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative8 of the Congo and Djibouti, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

- 1024, Statements were made by the representatives of the Sudan, Mauritania, Djibouti and the Congo and by the President, in hi8 capacity as the representative of Zambia.
- 1025. The mooting war then suspended briefly.
- 1026, When the mooting resumed, the Council commonced its voting procedure.
- 1027, Before the vote, the reprarentative of the United States made a statement.
- 1026, The Council thon procooded to th8 vote on thr draft recolution before it.

Decision: At the 2810th meeting, on 25 April 1988, the draft resolution (S/19819) was adopted by 14 votes in favour (Algeria, Argentina, Brasil, China, France, Germany, Federal Republic of, Italy, Japan, Nepal, Senegal, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Yugoslavia and Zambia) to none against, with 1 abstention (United States of America) as resolution 611 (1988).

1029. Resolution 6 1 1 (1988) reads as follows:

"The Security Council,

"Having considered the letter dated 19 April 1988, 1/ in which Tunisia made a complaint against Israel following the new act of aggression committed by the latter against the soversignty and territorial integrity of Tunisia,

"Having heard the statement by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Tunisia, 2/

"Having noted with concern that the aggression perpetrated on 16 April 1968 in the locality of Sidi Bou Said has caused loss of human life, particularly the cossination of Mr. Khalil al-Wasir,

"Recalling chat in accordance with Article 2, paragraph 4, of the Charter of thr United Nations, all Member States shall refrain in their international relations from the threat or use of force against the territor, al integrity or political independence of any State, of from acting in any other manner inconsistent with the purposes of the United Nations,

"Considering that in it8 rrrolution 573 (1985), adopted following thr act of aggression committed on 1 October 1985 by Israel against the sovereignty and territorial integrity of Tunisia, it has condemned Israel and has demanded that Israel refrain from perpetrating such acts of aggression or from threatening to do so,

"Gravely concerned by the act of aggression which constitutes a serious and renewed threat to peace, security and stability in the Moditerranean region,

- 1030. Following the vote, a statement war made by the representative of the United Kingdom,
- 1031. The representative of the PLO made a statement.
- 1032. A statement wan also made by the Minister for Foreign Affair8 of Tunisia.

Chapter 12

INTERNATIONAL COURT OF JUSTICE

A. Election of a member of the International Court of Justice

1035. In a memorandum dated 4 August 1987 (S/19018), the Secretary-General described the steps to be taken in accordance with Article 14 of the Statute of the Court in order to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Judger Guy Laderit de Lacharrière on 10 March 1987. The memorandum also described the composition of the Court and the laction procedure to be followed in the General Assembly and in the Security Council.

1036 On 20 August, in accordance with Article 7 of the Statute of the Court, the Secretary-General submitted to the Assembly and the Council the name of the candidate nominated by national groups (\$/19062). In a note of the name date (\$/19063), the Secretary-General circulated the curriculum vitae of the candidate. Additional nominations by national groups were circulated on 10 September (\$/19123).

1037. At the 2752nd meeting, on 14 September, efter reviewing the procedure, the President selected, by drawing lots, the names of two delegations, Japan and Italy, to designate One member each to serve as tellers.

1038. The Council thrn proceeded to vote by • ocrot ballot on the candidate nominated in documents \$/19062 and \$/19123.

1039. On the first ballot, Mr. Gilbert Guillaume (France) received 15 votes.

1040. The President of the Council communicated by a latter to the President of the General Assembly the result of the vote in the Council, Tho Council remained in session, pending the result of the vote in the Assembly. Upon receipt of the letter from the President of the General Assembly, the President informed the Council that, in the balloting hald simultaneously in the General Assembly, Mr. Guillaume had also received the required majority of votes and had therefore born elected a member of the International Court of Justice for a term of office expiring on 5 Frbruary 1991.

B. Election of five members of the International Court of Justice

1041. In a memorandum dated 8 October (S/19155), thr Secretary-General drew attention to the fact that, on 5 February 1908, the terms of office of five members of the International Court of Justice would expire end that the Security Council and the General Assembly, during the forty-second session of the Assembly, would have to elect five members for a trrm of office of nine years, beginning on 6 February 1986, The mrmorandum also set out the composition of the Court and the election procedure to be followed in the Council and the Assembly.

1042. On 8 October, in accordance with Article 7 of the Statute of the Court, the Secretary-General submitted to the Assembly and the Council the list of candidates nominated by national groups to fill the five vacancies in the Court (S/19156 and S/19157). On the same date, the Secretary-General circulated the curricula vitae of these candidates (S/19158).

1043. On 5 November, the Secretary-General submitted to the General Assembly and the Security Council a revised list of candidates (S/19156/Rev.1), incorporating the information contained in documents S/19156 and S/19157 and a nomination subsequently received.

1044. At its 2760th meeting, on 11 November, the Council proceeded to vote by secret ballot on the candidates included in the list, as revised (\$\frac{5}{19156}/Rev.1). The President stated that, in accordance with the practice followed by the Council, if more than five candidates obtained the required absolute majority of eight votes, a new vote would be taken on all the candidates. If fewer than five candidates obtained the absolute majority, the Council would proceed to a further ballot on the remaining vacancies and balloting would continue until five of the candidates had obtained the required majority of votes. Before the vote, the President selected, by drawing lots, the names of two delegations, Zambia and Ghana, to designate one member each to serve as tellers.

1045. On the first ballot, five candidates received the required majority:

Mr. Stephen Schwebel (United States of America)

Mr. Nikolai Tarassov (Union of Soviet Socialist Republics)

Mr. Roberto Ago (Italy)

Mr. Mohammed Bedjaoui (Algeria)

14 votes

Mr. José Sette-Câmara (Brazil)

16 votes

17 votes

1046. The President of the Council communicated by a letter to the President of the General Assembly the names of the five candidates who had received the required majority in the Council. After the President announced that the voting in the General Assembly had been inconclusive, the meeting of the Security Council was suspended. Upon resumption of the meeting, the President informed the Council that, as a result of the independent voting in the Security Council and in the General Assembly, only four candidates, Mr. Roberto Ago, Mr. Mohammed Bedjaoui, Mr. Stephen Schwebel and Mr. Nikolai Tarassov, having received the required absolute majority of votes in both bodies, were elected members of the International Court of Justice for a term of office of nine years, beginning on 6 February 1988.

1047. The President announced that as four candidates had been elected members of the International Court of Justice, in accordance with the provisions of Article 11 of the Statute of the Court, the Security Council had to proceed to a second meeting to fill the remaining vacancy.

1048. At the 2761st meeting, on the same date, the Council proceeded with the election of one candidate for the seat remaining vacant. In the absence of **objection**, the President appointed the same tellers as at the previous meeting. On the first ballot, Mr. José Sette-Câmara (Brazil) received eight votes.

1049. The President of the Council notified the President of the General Assembly of the result of the vote in the Council. The Council remained in session pending the result of the vote in the Assembly. Upon receipt of the letter from the President of the General Assembly, the President informed the Council that, as a **result** of the independent voting in the Security Council and in the General Assembly, different candidates had obtained the required majority of votes in each body. Therefore, in accordance with the provisions of Article 11 of the Statute of the Court, it was necessary to hold a third meeting of the Security Council to fill the remaining vacancy.

1050. At the 2762nd meeting, also held on 11 November, the Council proceeded with the election of one candidate for the seat remaining vacant. In the absence of objection, the President appointed the same tellers as at the previous meetings. On the first ballot, Mr. Mohamed Shahabuddeen (Guyana) received 10 votes.

1051. The President communicated the result of the vote to the President of the General Assembly. The Council remained in session pending the result of the vote in the Assembly. Upon receipt of the letter from the President of the General Assembly, the President informed the Council that as a result of the independent voting in the Security Council and in the General Assembly, Mr. Mohamed Shahabuddeen had obtained the required majority of votes in both bodies and had therefore been elected as a member of the International Court of Justice for a term of office of nine years beginning on 6 February 1988.

APPLICATION OF NAURU TO BECOME A PARTY TO THE STATUTE OF THE INTERNATIONAL COURT OF JUSTICE

1052. The Security Council at it8 2753rd meeting, on 1.5 October 1907, decided to refer to its Committer of Experts, for consideration and report, a letter dated 21 August (8119137) by which the Acting President and Minister for External Affairs of the Republic of Nauru had informed the Secretary-General of Nauru's desire to become a party to the Statute of the International Court of Justice and asked to be informed of the condition8 required to become a party to the Statute.

1053. At it8 2754th meeting, on 19 October, the Council had before it the report of the Committee of Expert8 dated 16 October (S/19213) which advised the Council to transmit the following recommendation to the General Assembly:

"The Security Council recommends that the General Assembly, in accordance with Article 93, paragraph 2, of the Charter, determine the conditions on which the Republic of Nauru may become a party to the Statute of the International Court of Justice, as follows:

"The Republic of Nauru will become a party to the Statute on the date of the deposit with the Secretary-Qmneral of the United Nations of an instrument, signed on behalf of the Government of the Republic of Nauru and ratified as may be required by the constitutional law of the Republic of Nauru, containinga

- "(a) Acceptance of the provisions of the Statute of the International Court of Justice;
- "(b) Acceptance of all the obligation8 of a Member of the United Nations under Article 94 of the Charter:
- "(c) An undertaking to contribute to the expenses of the Court such quitable amount as the General Assembly shall assess from time to time, after consultation with the Qovernment of the Republic of Nauru."

1054. The Chairman of the Committee of Experts, in submitting the report, pointed out that under Article 93, paragraph 2, of the Charter the conditions on which a State which was not a Member of the United Nations may become a party to the Statute were to be letermined in each case by the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the Security Council. Accordingly, the conditions recommended above as appropriate to the case of the Republic of Nauru were not intended to constitute a precedent to be followed either by the Security Council or by the General Assembly in any future care under Article 93, paragraph 2.

Decision: At the 2754th meeting, on 19 October 1987, the Security Council adopted the recommendation of the Committee of Experts with regard to the application of the Republic of Nauru to become a party to the Statute of the International Court of Justice unanimously as resolution 600 (1987).
