PREVENTION OF AN ARMS RACE IN **OUTER** SPACE

Report of the First Committee

Rapporteur: Mr. Dimitris PLATIS (Greece)

I. INTRODUCTION

1. The item entitled "Prevention of an arms race in outer space" was included in the provisional agenda of the forty-fourth session in accordance with General Assembly resolution **43/70** of 7 December 1988.

2. At its 3rd plenary **meeting**, on 22 September 1989, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include the item in its agenda and to allocate it to the First Committee.

3. At its 2nd meeting, on 13 October, the First Committee decided to hold a general debate on the disarmament items allocated to it, namely, items 49 to 69 and 151. The deliberations on those items took place between the 3rd and 25th meetings, from 16 October to 1 November (see A/C.1/44/PV.3-25). Consideration of and action on draft resolutions on those items took place between its 26th and 41st meetings, from 2 to 17 November (see A/C.1/44/PV.26-41).

B. Draft resolution A/C.1/44/L.16

7. On 30 Octoober, Bulgaria, the Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, Csechoslovakia, the German Democratic Republic, Hungary, Mongolia, Poland, the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics submitted a draft resolution entitled "Prevention of an arms race in outer space" (A/C.1/44/L.16), which read as follows:

"The General Assembly,

"Recalling its relevant resolutions and the applicable provisions of the Final Document of the Tenth Special Session of the General Assembly, 2/

"Taking into account the discussions that took place at the fifteenth special session of the General Assembly, the third special session devoted to disarmament,

"<u>Recalling</u> the provisions of articles III and IV of the Treaty on Principles Governing *the* Activities of States in the Exploration and Use of Outer Space, including the Moon and Other Celestial Bodies, <u>3</u>/

"<u>Reaffirming</u> that the exploration and use of outer space, including the Moon and other celestial bodies, shall be carried out for the benefit and in the interest of all countries, and shall be the province of all mankind,

"<u>Considering</u> that there is a need to unite the efforts of the whole international community to draw up an 'open space' régime and to develop and intensify comprehensive co-operation for the peaceful exploitation of outer

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space, which would be facilitated by substantive consideration by the international community of the proposal8 put forward by various countries,

"Emphasizing the crucial significance of confidence-building measures, openness and transparency relating to apace activities for the development of international co-operation in the peaceful exploitation of outer apace and the strengthening of international security,

"Noting the significance of preventing an armr race in outer space for ensuring strategic stability and lasting international security in condition8 in which the process of real nuclear disarmament ha8 begun,

"Emphasizing the paramount importance of compliance with the relevant agreement8 in the field of disarmament relating to outer space, including the 1972 Treaty on the Limitation of Anti-Ballistic Missile Systems 4/ and the whole existing system of international law relating to the use of outer apace,

"Emphasizing also the need to ensure strict verification of ccmpliance with obligation8 with respect to the prevention of an arm8 race in outer apace, and of creating for there purposes a system of international verification to preserve peace in outer space,

"Noting the growing understanding of the need to draw up an international code of conduct for State8 in outer apace,

"Noting further the progress made towards the deepening of mutual understanding in the bilateral negotiation8 between the Union of Soviet Socialist Republic8 ar 1 the United State8 of America on a complex of questiona relating to nuclear and space weapons,

"Desiring that the negotiation8 between the Union of Soviet Socialist Republic8 and the United States of America should lead as soon a8 possible to tangible results and should stimulate multilateral consideration of questions relating to the prevention of an arms race in owter space,

"1. <u>Recalls</u> the obligation of all **States**, in accordance with the Charter of the United Nations, to refrain from the threat or use of force in general and in relation to outer space;

"2. <u>Calls upon</u> all States, especially those with major space capabilities, to comply strictly with existing legal agreements, both multilateral and bilateral, including the 1972 Treaty on the Limitation of Anti-Ballistic Missile Systems, aimed at preventing an arms race in outer space;

"3. <u>Emphasizes</u> that concrete measures with appropriate and \bullet ffoctive provisions for verification to prevent an arms race in outer space should be taken by the international community;

"4. <u>Calls upon</u> all States conducting space activities to be guided by the principles of openness and transparency and to prom&to the \bullet atabliahmoat and strengthening of ar atmosphere of mutual trust;

"5. <u>Reiterates</u> that the Conference on Disarmament, as the single multilateral disarmament negotiating forum has the primary role in the consideration of questions concerning the conclusion of a multilateral agreement or agreements, as appropriate, on the prevention of an arms race in outer apace in all its aspects;

"6. <u>Requests</u> the Conference on Disarmament to re-establish an <u>ad hoc</u> committee on the prevention of an arms race in outer space at the beginning of it8 1990 session with a view to giving substantive consideration to the whole set of questions concerning the prevention of an arms race in outer • $\square \odot \square \square \square \square \square \square \square \square \square$ paying particular attention to the discussion of proposals submitted by States on the establishment of internsticaal verification mechanisms to preserve peace in outer apace and on the utilisation of space-based means of observation to ensure compliance with international obligation8 with respect to disarmament and the maintenance of international security;

"7. <u>Calls upon</u> all States to make a constructive contribution to the work of the <u>ad hoc</u> committee;

"8. <u>Decides</u> to include in the provisional agenda of its forty-fifth session the item entitled 'Prevention of an arms race in outer space'."

o. At the request of the **sponsors**, no action was **taken** on draft resolution A/C.1/44/L.16.

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9. "The General Assembly,

"Mecalling its relevant resolution8 and the applicable provisions of the Final Document of the Tenth Special Session of the General Assembly, 5/

"**Recognizing** the common interest of all mankind in the exploration and use of outer space for peaceful purposes,

"<u>Reaffirming</u> that the exploration and use of outer space, including the Moon and other celestial bodies, shall be carried out for the benefit and in the interest of all countries, irrespective of **wheir** degree of economic or scientific development, and that outer space shall be the province of all mankind,

"Recalling that the States Parties to the Treaty on Principle? Governing the Activities of States in the Exploration and Use of Outer Space, including the Moon and Other Celestial Bodies, 6/ have undertaken, in article III, to carry on activities in the exploration and use of outer space, including the Moon and other celestial bodies, in accordance with international **Jaw** and the Charter of the United Nations, *in* the interest of maintaining international peace and security and promoting international ca-operation and understanding,

"Reaffirming, in particular, article IV of the above-mentioned Treaty, which stipulates that States parties to the Treaty undertake not to place in orbit around the Earth any objects carrying muclear weapons or any other kinds of weapons of mass destruction, install **suc** weapons on celestial bodies, or station such weapons in outer space in **any** other manner,

"Recognizing the significant role that the legal rdgime applicable to outer space plays in the prevention of an arms race in that environment, and further recognising however that the legal régime by itself does not guarantee the prevention of an arms race in outer space, that there is need to consolidate and reinforce that régime and to enhance its effectiveness and that it is important to comply strictly with existing agreements, both bilateral and multilateral,

"Noting the significant increase in international confidence and trust that would result from greater openness and transparency in activities carried out in outer space,

"<u>Convinced</u> that further efforts should be made in the search for effective and verifiable agreements on the interrelated questions of preventing an arms race in outer space and terminating it *on* Earth,

"Noting with satisfaction that bilateral negotiations between the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the United States of America have continued since 1985 on a complex of questions concerning space and nuclear arms, both strategic and intermediate-range, with the declared objective, $\boldsymbol{\epsilon}$.dorsed in the joint statement of their leaders on 21 November 1985, of working out effective agreements aimed, inter alia, at preventing an arms race in outer space,

"<u>Recognizing</u> that riquificant progress in the multilateral domain is dependent upon basic understandings achieved by the Union of Soviet Socialirt Republicr and the United States of America in their bilateral negotiations,

"Recalling the obligation of all States, in accordance with Article 2, paragraph 4, c. the Charter, to refrain from the threat or use of force, including in the area of outer apace, as well as the inherent right of individual or collective self-defence in accordance with Article 51 of the Charter,

"1. <u>Welcomes</u> the re-establishment of an <u>Ad Hoc</u> Committee on the Prevention of an Arms Race in Outer Space during the 1969 session of the Conference on Disarmament, the single multilateral negotiating forum;

"2. <u>Considers</u> that it is necessary to continue and to further the examination and identification of the subjects covered by the mandate of the <u>Ad Hoc</u> Committee and specified *in* its programme of work;

"3. <u>Urges</u> all States to take into account the importance of greater openness and transparency in their space activities,

"4. Emphasizes that multilateral efforts related to outer space and aimed at advancing the cause of diratmament, peace, atability and international trurt rhould be supportive of the efforts in the bilateral neqotiationr between the Union of Soviet Socialirt Republics and the United Stater of America to prevent an arms race in outer space and to eliminate it on Earth;

"5. <u>Recognizes</u> the further riquificant contribution that the ongoing negotiations between the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the United States of America could make to maintaining international peace and security;

"6. <u>Strongly urges</u> the Union of Soviet Socialist Republic8 and the United States of America to continue to pursue intensively their bilateral neqotiotionr in search of effective and verifiable agreements aimed at preventing an arms race in outer space and terminating it on Earth, at drastically reducing nuclear arms and at strengthening international stability;

"7. <u>Calls upon</u> all States to make every effort to encourage an early and successful outcome to these negotiations;

"8. <u>Emphasizes</u> the necessity of preventing the erosion of relevant existing treaties and in this *context* reaffirm8 the vital importance of a rigorous observation of the Treaty on the Limitation of Anti-Ballistic Missile Systems; <u>7</u>/

"9. Urges the Conference on Disarmament to continue it8 work in the area of the prevention of an arm8 race in outer space."

D . Draft resolution A/C.1/44/L.28

11. On 30 October, <u>China</u> rubmitted a draft terolution entitled "Prevention of an arm8 race in outer space" (A/C.1/44/L.28), which read a8 follows:

"The General Assembly,

"Reaffirming that outer space is the common heritage of mankind, and that the peaceful \bigcirc xplotation and use of outer space, including the Mbon and other celestial bodies, a8 a common aspiration of all countries *in* the world, shall be carried out for the benefit and in the interests of all countries, and shall be the province of all mankind,

"Recalling the principle8 and objective8 of the 1967 Treaty on Principle8 Governing the Activities of State8 in the Exploration and Use of Outer Space, including the Moon and Other Colestial Bodies, $\underline{6}$ / and in particular articles III and IV thereof,

"<u>Recalling also</u> paragraph 60 of the Final Document of the Tenth Special Session of the General Assembly <u>9</u>/ and its relevant resolutions since 1981,

"Especially bearing in mind it8 resolution 43/70 of 7 December 1968,

"<u>Convinced</u> that the development of apace weapon8 entail8 a qualitative escalation of the already serious arms taco and poses a new threat to international peace and stability, and that to prevent an Arms race *in* outer space ha8 consequently become a new priority in the field of disarmament,

"<u>Believing</u> that the prohibition of space weapons constitutes an effective means to prevent an arms race *in* outer space,

"<u>Fully taking note</u> of the urgent demand of the international community that immediate and effective measures be taken to prevent an arm8 race in outer space,

"Affirmin' need to consolidate and reinforce the legal régime applicable to c space and recognizing that this legal régime, as such, is not sufficient to guarantee the prevention of an arm8 taco in outot space,

"<u>Recognizing</u> that, with a view to achieving the goal of preventing an arm8 race in outer space, measures may be considered in the following areas, simultaneously or separately:

"(a) The complete prohibition of all type8 of rpace weapons including anti-missile weapon8 and anti-satellite weapons, so a8 to realize the 'non-weaponization' of outer space;

"(b) The prohibition of thr use or throat of force and any other hostile action8 or throat of such action8 within outer space, against outot space from the Earth or from outer rpace against the Earth,

"Believing that the two State8 with the largest rpace capabilities boat a special responsibility for the prevention of an arm8 taco in outot space,

"Noting the bilateral negotiations on questions concerning rpace and nuclear arms between the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the United States of America that have continued since 1985, and hoping that positive results will • morgo from these negotiations as soon as possible,

"<u>Emphasizing</u> the mutually complementaty nature of bilatrtal and multilateral efforts in the field of preventing an arms race in outer space,

"Taking not). of the consideration of the guestion by the Conference on Disarmament, 10/

"<u>Melcoming</u> the re-establishment of the <u>Ad Hoq</u> Committee on the Prevention of an Arms Race in Outer Space by the Confe ence on Disarmament during it8 1989 session,

"<u>Noting with regret</u> that the <u>Ad Hoc</u> Committee so fat has not been able to start negotiations on an international agreement for the prevention of an arms race in outer space,

"1. <u>Calls upon</u> all States, • specially those with rpace capabilities, to refrain, in their activities relating to outer space, from action8 contrary to the observance of the relevant existing treaties or to the objective of preventing an arms race in outer space, and calls upon them to contribute actively to the realisation of the objective of the peaceful use of outer space and to adopt prompt and effective measures to prevent an arm8 race in outer space;

"2. Urges the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the United States of America, the two major space Powers currently \bullet ngagod in the development of rpace weapons, to refrain from developing, testing, producing and deploying spaceweaponr, to destroy all their \bullet xi8ting rpace weaponr, to conduct serious bilateral negotiations on the prevention of an arm8 race in outer rpace and to keep the Conference on Disarmament properly informed of the progress of these negotiations,

"3. <u>Requests</u> the Conference on Disarmament, the single multilateral disarmament negotiating body, to accolotate the consideration of the question of proventing an arms race in outer rpace in all its aspects as a matter of priority and urgency, taking into account all the relevant draft resolutions and proposals J

"4. <u>Requests</u> the Conference on Disarmament to re-establish immediately the <u>Ad Hoc</u> Committee on the Prevention of an Arm8 Race in Outer Space with an adequate mandate at the outset of it8 1990 session, with a view to initiating negotiations for concluding an international agreement or agreements, as appropriate, on the prohibition and destruction of all rpace weaponr and on the prohibition of the use of force or hostile actions in, to or from outer spaces

"5. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to transmit to the Conference on Disarmament all th8 documenta relating to the consideration of this item by the General Assembly at it8 forty-fourth session;

"6. <u>Requests</u> the Conference on Disarmament to submit a report in it8 conrideration of this subject to the General Assembly at its forty-fifth session;

"7. <u>Decides</u> to include in the provisional agonda of it8 forty-fifth session the item entitled 'Prrvention of an arms race in outer space'."

12. At the request of the sponsor, no action was taken on draft resolution A/C. 1/44/L. 28.

III. RECOMMENDATION **OF** THE FIRST COMMITTEE

13. The First Committee recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft resolution;

Prevention of an arms race in outer space

The General Assembly,

Inspired by the great prospect8 opening up before mankind a8 a result of man's entry into outer space,

Recognizing the common interest of all mankind in the exploration and use of outer space for peaceful purposes,

<u>Reaffirming</u> that the oxploration and use of outer space, including the Moon and other celestial bodies, shall be carried out for the benefit and in the interest of all countries, irrespective of their degree of economic or scientific development, and shall be the province of all mankind,

<u>Reaffirming also</u> the will of all State8 that the exploration and use of outer rpace, including the Moon and other celestial bodies, shall be for peaceful purposes,

<u>Recalling</u> the obligation of all States, in accordance with the Charter of the United Nations, to refrain from the threat or use of force, including in their rpace activities,

<u>Recalling</u> that the Statos parties to the Treaty on Principles Govorning the Activities of States in the Exploration and Use of Outer Space, including the Moon and Other Celestial Bodies <u>11</u>/ have undertaken, in article III, to carry on activities in the exploration and use of outer space, including the Moon and other celestial bodies, in accordance with international law and the Charter of the United Nations, in the interests of maintaining international peace and security and promoting international *co-operation* and understanding,

Reaffirming, in particular, article IV of the above-montioned Treaty, which stipulates that States parties to the Treaty undertake not to place in orbit around the Earth any objects carrying nuclear weapons or any other kinds of weapons of mass destruction, install such weapons on celestial bodies or station such weapons in outer space in any other manner,

<u>Reaffirming also</u> paragraph 80 of the Final Document of the Tenth Special Session of the Genoral Assembly, <u>12</u>/ in which it is stated that in order to prevent an arm8 race in outer apace further measures should be taken and appropriate international negotiations held in accordance with the spirit of the Treaty,

Noting its resolutions 36/97 C and 36/99 of 9 December 1981, a8 well as resolutions 37/83 of 9 Docember 1982, 37/99 D of 13 December 1982, 38/70 of 15 December 1983, 39/59 of 12 December 1984, 40/87 of 12 December 1985, 41/53 of 3 December 1986, 42/33 of 30 November 1987 and 43/70 of 7 December 1988 and the relevant paragraph8 of the Declaration adopted by the Ninth Conference of Heads of State or Government of the Movement of Non-Aligned Countries, held at Belgrade from 4 to 7 September 1989, <u>13</u>/

<u>Recognizing</u> th8 importance and urgency of proventing an arm8 race in outer space and the readiness of all stat88 to contribute to that common objective,

<u>Gravely concerned</u> at the dangor posed to all mankind by an arm8 race in outer space and, in particular, by developments that could further undermine international peace and security and retard the pursuit of general and complete disarmament,

Noting the grave concern expressed by the Second United Nation8 Conference on the Exploration and Peaceful Uses of Outer Space at the oxtenrion of an arm8 race into outer space and the recommendations <u>14</u>/ mad8 to the competent organ8 of the United Nations, in particular the General Assembly, and also to the Committee on Disarmament, <u>15</u>/

Noting also that in 1989 tho <u>Ad Hoc</u> Committee on the Prevention of an Arm8 Race in Outer Space, taking into account it8 previous efforts since it8 • Stabli8hmOnt, undortook the examination and identification of various issues, existing agreements and existing proposals, a8 well a8 future initiatives relevant to the prevention of an arm8 race in outer space, <u>16</u>/ and that this contributed to a better understanding of a number of problems and to a clearer perception of the various positions,

<u>Convinced</u> that additional measures should be examined in the search for effective and verifiable bilateral and multilateral agrooments in order to prevent an arm8 race in outer space,

<u>Emphasizing</u> the paramount importance of strict compliance with existing arms limitation and disarmament agreement8 relevant to outer space, and with the existing legal régime concerning the use of outer space,

<u>Recognizing</u> that bilateral negotiation8 botween the United States of America and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republic8 could facilitate the multilateral negotiations for the prevention of an arm8 race in outer space in accordance with paragraph 27 of the Final Document of the Tenth Special Session of the Geners1 Assembly,

Noting the importance in this context of bilateral negotiations between the Union of Soviot Socialist Ropublic8 and the United States of America that have continued since 1985, including at their summit meetings in Washington, D.C. and Moscow on a complex of questions concorning space and nuclear arm8,

Hopeful that concrete results would emerge from these negotiations a8 loon a8 possible,

Emphasizing the mutually complementary naturo of bilateral and multilateral efforts in the field of preventing an arm8 race in outer space,

Taking note of that part of the roport of the Conference on Disarmament relating to this question, $\frac{18}{10}$

Welcoming the re-establishment of an <u>Ad Hoc</u> Committoo on the Provention of an Arm8 Race in Outer Space during the 1989 session of the Conference on Disarmament, in the exercise of the negotiating responsibilities of this sole multilateral negotiating body on disarmament, to continue to examine and to identify, through substantive and general consideration, issues relevant to the provention of an arm8 race in outer apace,

1. **<u>Reaffirms</u>** that general and complete disarmament under offoctivo international control warrants that outer space shall be used exclusively for peaceful purposes and that it shall not become an arena for an arms race;

2. <u>Recognizes</u>, a8 stated in the report of the <u>Ad Hoc</u> Committoo of the Conference on Disarmament, that the legal régime applicable to outer space by itself does not guarantee the prevention of an arm8 race in outer space, that this legal régime play8 a significant role in the prevention of an arm8 race in that environment, the need to consolidate and reinforce that régime and

3. <u>Emphasizes</u> that further measures with appropriate and effective provisions for verification to prevent an arm8 race in outer rpace should be adopted by the international community;

4. <u>Calls upon</u> all States, in particular those with major space capabilities, to contribute actively to the objective of the peacoful use of outer rpace and to take immediate measures to prevent an arm8 race in outer space in the interest of maintaining international peace and security and promoting international co-operation and understanding;

5. <u>Reiterates</u> that the Conference on Disarmament, a8 the single multilateral disarmament negotiating forum, ha8 the primary role in tho negotiation of a multilateral agroomont or agreements, a8 appropriate, on tho provontion of an arm8 race in outer space in all it8 aspects;

6. <u>Requests</u> the Conference on Disarmament to consider a8 a matter of priority the question of preventing an arm8 race in outer space;

7. <u>Also requests</u> the Conference on Disarmament to intensify it8 consideration of the question of the prevention of an arm8 race in outer rpace in all its aspects, taking into account relevant proposals and initiatives, including these presented in the <u>Ad Hoc</u> Committee at the 1989 session of the Conference and at the forty-fourth session of the General Assembly;

8. <u>Further requests</u> the Conference on Disarmament to re-establish an <u>ad hoq</u> committee with an adequate mandate at the beginning of its 1990 session, with a view to undertaking negotiations for the conclusion of an agrooment or agreements, as appropriate, to provont an arms race in Outer space in all it 8 aspects;

9. Urges the Union of Soviet Socialist Republic8 and the United States of America to pursue intensively their bilateral negotiation8 in a constructive spirit aimed at reaching early agreement for preventing an arm8 race in outer space, and to advise the Conference on Disarmament periodically of the progress of their bilateral sessions so a8 to facilitate it8 work;

10. <u>Calls upon</u> all States, especially those with major space capabilities, to refrain, in their activities relating to outer space, from actions contrary to the observance of the relevant existing treaties or to the objective of preventing an arms race in outer space;

13, <u>Requests</u> the Socrotary-Geaoral to transmit to the Conforence on Disarmament all documents relating to the consideration of this subject by the Ganoral Assembly at it8 forty-fourth session;

14. <u>Decides</u> to include in the provisional agenda of its forty-fifth session the item entitled "Prevention of an arms race in outer space".
