The statement, which is directly linked to the earlier statement by the Permanent South Pacific Commission brought to your attention in a letter dated 15 June 1990 (A/45/314), contains a strong protest by the members of the Commission

against the further nuclear test conducted in French Polynesia on 7 June 1990 and reaffirms their categorical condemnation of the nuclear tests conducted by France in the Murure Atoll, since such tests obviously constitute a threat to the marine environment and marine resources.

STATEMENT BY THE PERMANENT SOUTH PACIFIC COMMISSION

On 7 June 1990 a further nuclear test was conducted in French Polynesia, just four days following the resumption by France of nuclear tests in the Pacific Basin, with the test conducted in the Mururoa Atoll on 3 June, which gave rise to the statement of 8 June issued by the Permanent South Pacific Commission.

In implementation of the Permanent South Pacific Commission policy for the protection of the marine environment, and in implementation of the Viiia **del** Mar Declaration issued by the Ministers for **Forcign** Affairs of the countries members of the Permanent Commission, the General Secretariat strongly deplores the continuation of such tests despite strong, wide opposition from the countries in the Pacific Basin, particularly from the members of the Permanent Commission. It also reiterates its strong protest against the recent nuclear tests as well as its urgent call for an immediate and definitive cessation of such tests, since they constitute a threat to the marine environment and marine resources.
