Letter dated 13 July 1990 from the Chargé d'affaires a.i. of the Permanent Mission of Pakistan to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

Further to our letter dated 15 January 1990 (A/45/79-S/21080), I have the honour to report to you the following two incidents of violation of Pakistan territory from the Afghanistan side, which occured on 14 and 26 June 1990:

"On 14 June 1990, at 0200 hours, the Kabul régime forces fired one SCUD missile, which landed in the area of Teri Mangal in the Kurram Agency. As a result, one Afghan refugee was injured.

"On 26 June 1990, at 1615 hours, the Kabul régime forces fired one SCUD missile, which landed in the area of Peiwar Kotal in the Kurram Agency. As a result, four Afghan refugees were injured."

The Afghan Chargé d'affaires was summoned to the Foreign Office on the morning of 1 July 1990 and a strong protest was lodged with him, asking the Kabul régime to stop such attacks immediately.

The Afghan Chargé d'affaires was also told about the rejection by the Government of Pakistan of the protests made by the Kabul régime, in which it was stated that on 6, 24 and 27 June 1990, Pakistani aircraft had violated Afghan territory. The allegations had been investigated and found to be baseless. The Kabul régime was advised to refrain from attempts to malign Pakistan by its propaganda campaign.

I request you to have this letter circulated as a document of the General Assembly, under items '9. The and 144 of the preliminary list, and of the Security Council.
