Message of greetings from the President of the USSR to participants in the Amendment Conference of the States Parties to the Treaty Banning Nuclear Weapon Tests in the Atmosphere, in Outer Space and under Water

I send greetings to your Conference and take this opportunity to reiterate the Soviet Union's unswerving commitment to the early achievement of a complete ban on nuclear tests as a major step towards a world without nuclear weapons. I confirm our readiness to discontinue our nuclear tests at any time if the United States does likewise. We are prepared to adopt an amendment to the 1963 Treaty in order to convert the restrictions contained in the Treaty into a comprehensive ban. We call on other countries to support this long-needed decision.
