Letter dated 21 November 1992 from the President of Yugoslavia
addressed to the President of Bosnia and Herzegovina

I have the pleasure to inform you that Mr. Elie Wiesel, Nobel prize winner and peacemaker, and Mr. Daniel S. Schiffer, a writer and journalist, will visit the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia on 27 November 1992. Any further description of Mr. Wiesel, a remarkable personality, seems superfluous.

Mr. Wiesel is coming to Yugoslavia with the sincere intention of providing assistance and making a contribution to the establishment of peace as soon as possible, something that is now our primary task.

Mr. Wiesel and I, accompanied by Mr. Karadžić, will arrive in Sarajevo at noon on 29 November, to meet with you and have another discussion on ways of stopping the bloodshed between the unfortunate peoples of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

If my health does not permit me to take part in that noble mission (I have just had an operation), Mr. Milan Panić, President of the Federal Government, will come in my stead.

I should be grateful if you would respond urgently and let me know if you agree that this meeting should take place.
