

## **Explanatory memorandum**

The Millennium Summit, the largest ever United Nations gathering, was held only a few weeks ago. The Summit adopted a forward-looking and ambitious Millennium Declaration. This Declaration, together with the Secretary-General's report for the Summit, sets a demanding agenda for the United Nations for the new millennium. There are many issues of concern. There is no shortage of challenges to the United Nations. What is important now is the implementation and the follow-up of the Declaration, which was called for in most of the statements delivered during the general debate at this session of the General Assembly.

To maintain the momentum created by the Millennium Summit we propose, taking into account the scope of the Millennium Declaration, that a new separate item entitled "Follow-up to the outcome of the Millennium Summit" be included in the agenda of the fifty-fifth session of the General Assembly.
