Secretary-General's Trust Fund to Assist States in the Settlement of Disputes through the International Court of Justice

Report of the Secretary-General**

Summary

The present report is submitted pursuant to paragraph 15 of the Terms of Reference, Guidelines and Rules of the Secretary-General's Trust Fund to Assist States in the Settlement of Disputes through the International Court of Justice issued at the time of the establishment of the Fund (see A/47/444, annex). It is subsequent to the report of the Secretary-General (A/56/456) submitted to the General Assembly at its fifty-sixth session under the agenda item entitled "Report of the International Court of Justice".

I. Mandate

1. The Trust Fund ("the Fund") was established in 1989 by the Secretary-General under the Financial Regulations and Rules of the United Nations following consultations with the President of the International Court of Justice (ICJ). In accordance with the Terms of Reference of the Fund,¹ financial assistance is to be provided to States for expenses incurred in connection with (a) a dispute submitted to the International Court of Justice by way of a special agreement or (b) the execution of a judgment of the Court resulting from such special agreement.

II. Beneficiaries

2. The Fund is open to all States parties to the Statute of the International Court of Justice and to non-member States having complied with the conditions stipulated in Security Council resolution 9 (1946) of 15 October 1946.

3. During the period under review, i.e., 1 January 2001 to 30 June 2002, the Fund did not receive any application.

III. Contributions

4. Voluntary contributions to the Fund may be made by States, intergovernmental organizations, national institutions and non-governmental organizations, as well as natural and juridical persons.

5. During the period under review, three States contributed to the Fund, as listed below.

6. As at 30 June 2002, the total balance of the Fund was \$1,742,901.52. This amount excludes awards which have already been paid.

IV. Needs assessment

7. The Charter of the United Nations recognizes settlement of international disputes "by peaceful means, and in conformity with the principles of justice and international law" as one of the basic purposes of the United Nations and as an essential tool for the maintenance of international peace and security. ICJ is the principal judicial organ of the Organization. As noted above, the Fund was created with a view to facilitating a decision by parties to a dispute to seek judicial settlement of their dispute through ICJ. Despite numerous appeals by the Secretary-

General, the Fund has had decreasing resources since its inception. States and other relevant entities are therefore urged to give serious consideration to making contributions to the Fund, not only in a substantial manner but also on a regular basis.

8. With a view to encouraging States to apply for grants from the Fund, a review of the existing procedures governing the use of the Fund is currently being undertaken by the offices concerned. A number of measures to provide a wider dissemination of information concerning the Fund, e.g. by establishing a web site, are being considered.
