Note #1 The year 2002 JAF has adopted the National Training Program; the number of trainees involved for the initial stage will be 10,000 individual, all are expected from the students with secondary class levels.

Note #2 JAF offers free education to about 6,000 students from rural and Badia inhabitants, and offer their in additional free lunch.

Note #3 A total of 13 teams, each dispatched for about one month, teams dispatched initially were composed of 10 medical doctors and 20 nurses and technicians, later on they were composed of 3 medical doctors and 7 nurses and technicians; this was primarily due to the change in the nature of the task.

Note #4 A 50-bed Mobile Field Hospital (JMFH) was deployed in West region of Afghanistan at Zabol Airfield to provide medical support and health care to military and civilian personnel in the area of mission I (AOM).

Note #5 A 40-bed Mobile Field Hospital (JMFH) was deployed in Iraq to provide medical support and health care to civilians.

Note #6 JAF participates in funding Ophthalmic Bank & National Center for Diabetes and Endocrine annually by 195,000 JD.
