## **Cooperation between the United Nations and the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons**

## The General Assembly,

*Recalling* its resolution 63/115 of 5 December 2008 on cooperation between the United Nations and the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons,

*Having received* the annual report for 2008 and the report for 2009 of the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons on the implementation of the Convention on the Prohibition of the Development, Production, Stockpiling and Use of Chemical Weapons and on Their Destruction,<sup>1</sup>

1. *Takes note* of the annual report for 2008 and the report for 2009 of the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons submitted on its behalf by its Director-General;<sup>1</sup>

2. *Welcomes* the decision of the fourteenth session of the Conference of States Parties to the Convention on the Prohibition of the Development, Production, Stockpiling and Use of Chemical Weapons and on Their Destruction<sup>2</sup> on the appointment of Ambassador Ahmet Üzümcü as the Director-General of the Technical Secretariat of the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons;

3. *Decides* to include in the provisional agenda of its sixty-seventh session the sub-item entitled "Cooperation between the United Nations and the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons".
