## **Appointments to fill vacancies in subsidiary organs and other appointments: confirmation of the appointment of members of the Investments Committee**

### **Report of the Fifth Committee**

1. At its 34th plenary meeting, on 26 October 2017, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include in the agenda of its seventy-second session the item entitled “Appointments to fill vacancies in subsidiary organs and other appointments: confirmation of the appointment of members of the Investments Committee” and to allocate it to the Fifth Committee.
2. At its 11th meeting, on 2 November 2017, the Fifth Committee had before it the note by the Secretary-General in which, in accordance with the provisions of article 20 and section E of annex III of the Regulations, Rules and Pension Adjustment System of the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund,<sup>1</sup> the Secretary-General, after consultation with the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Board and the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, submitted for confirmation by the General Assembly the appointment of Kemi Adeosun (Nigeria) and Keiko Honda (Japan) as ad hoc members of the Investments Committee for a one-year term of office beginning on 1 January 2018 ([A/C.5/72/9](#)).
3. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, by acclamation, to recommend to the General Assembly that it confirm the appointment of Kemi Adeosun (Nigeria) and Keiko Honda (Japan) as ad hoc members of the Investments Committee for a one-year term of office beginning on 1 January 2018 (see para. 4).

### **Recommendation of the Fifth Committee**

4. The Fifth Committee recommends that the General Assembly confirm the appointment by the Secretary-General of the following persons as ad hoc members of the Investments Committee for a one-year term of office beginning on 1 January 2018:

Kemi Adeosun (Nigeria)  
Keiko Honda (Japan)
