I. Introduction

1. The General Assembly, in paragraph 1 of its resolution 74/24, called upon Member States to provide the Secretary-General, by 30 April annually, with a report on their military expenditures for the latest fiscal year for which data were available, using, preferably and to the extent possible, one of the online reporting forms, including, if appropriate, a nil report or the “single-figure” report on military expenditures or any other format developed in the context of similar reporting on military expenditures to other international or regional organizations.

II. Actions taken by the Secretariat

2. On 18 February 2022, the Secretariat sent a note verbale to Member States seeking their views on the subject, followed by email reminders sent in February to national points of contact and permanent missions of Member States in New York. The replies received are reproduced in section III below. Additional replies received after the processing of the present report will be posted on the website of the Office for Disarmament Affairs of the Secretariat¹ in the original language received.

3. The Office for Disarmament Affairs continued to maintain the online database for military expenditures and the online reporting tool. The use of the online tool by Member States to submit reports to the United Nations Report on Military Expenditures continued to decrease during the reporting period (see table 1).

4. The Office for Disarmament Affairs continued its efforts to promote the tool among Member States. Owing to the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic, which slowed activities worldwide during the reporting period, such efforts consisted mainly of circulating notes verbales to Member States.

Explanatory notes

5. As at the date of submission of the present consolidated report, the Secretary-General had received national reports from 32 Governments, including 2 single-figure reports and 1 nil report (see table 2). Some States provided clarifications and additional information on defence planning to explain their military expenditures. Those are also included in the present report.

6. The originals of the replies from States, if received by means other than the online reporting system, are on file with the Office for Disarmament Affairs.

Explanatory remarks

These notionally fund payments relating to military and superannuation benefits (MSBS), Defence Force retirement benefits (DFRB) and Defence Force retirement and death benefits (DFRDB) defined benefits schemes;
2. Total Defence non-financial asset additions (excluding land, buildings and infrastructure) and inventory additions have been amalgamated within category 3.1.11;
3. All figures disclosed are provided on an accrual basis and are aligned to the 2020-2021 Defence departmental and administered financial statements. Non-cash relevant items such as depreciation and amortization, write-offs, impairment loss and inventory consumption have been excluded;
4. Total Defence capital additions for land, buildings and infrastructure have been amalgamated within category 3.2.6.

Explanatory remarks

In the first quarter of 2020, the Netherlands, like the rest of the world, was hit by the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic. Developments associated with the COVID-19 pandemic had a serious impact on the budget. Now that society is gradually opening up, COVID-19 pandemic measures will be lifted but it will take time to return to the original level of operation. Arrears must be made up. The submitted budget figures were compiled by the outgoing third Rutte cabinet. That cabinet offered to resign on 15 January 2021 owing to the hard-hitting conclusions of the parliamentary investigation related to the childcare allowance. As caretaker, the cabinet worked holding a demissionary status over the course of the elections of 17 March 2021 and nearly a year after the resignation, the fourth Rutte cabinet took office on 10 January 2022.

Owing to the world's changing security situation and growing instability, the new cabinet is in the process of making urgent financial adjustments to contributions to defence. Those financial adjustments are reflected in the coalition agreement, which emphasizes the importance of investments in defence. The structural increase in the budget will enable the Ministry of Defence to take a major step forward, which is urgently needed and will lead to a substantial improvement in the operational readiness of the armed forces. This will have an effect on the budget in 2022. Attribution of extra money to defence shows that defence is one of the top priorities of the Netherlands.

Wherever and whenever possible, the Netherlands defence organization will adopt North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO)-agreed doctrine as national doctrine.
