

- <sup>1</sup> The following wording for the sub-items of the general debate is based on General Assembly resolution 34/182 of 18 December 1979:
- (a) Promotion of the establishment of a new, more just and more effective world information and communications order intended to strengthen peace and international understanding and based on the free circulation and wider and better balanced dissemination of information;
- (b) Continuation of the examination of United Nations public information policies and activities, in the light of the evolution of international relations, and the need to establish the new international economic order and the new world information and communications order;
- (c) Evaluation and follow-up of the efforts made and the progress achieved by the United Nations system in the field of information and communications.
