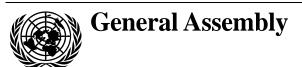

Statement of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Mongolia

Mongolia deeply regrets that the Democratic People's Republic of Korea proceeded with conducting a nuclear test on 9 October 2006 against the wishes and demands of the international community. The Democratic People's Republic of Korea's test will only result in further isolation of this country in the international arena and the danger of an arms race in the region. Mongolia reiterates its traditional positions in support of non-proliferation of nuclear weapons and a nuclear-weapon-free Korean Peninsula, and reaffirms the need to find a diplomatic solution to North Korea's nuclear issue. Mongolia urges the Democratic People's Republic of Korea to refrain from taking steps that would further aggravate the regional and international situation.
