Confirmation of the appointment of members of the Investments Committee

Note by the Secretary-General

1. At its 34th plenary meeting, on 26 October 2017, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee following the request of the Secretary-General ([A/72/231](#)), decided to include in the agenda of the seventy-second session, under the item entitled “Appointments to fill vacancies in subsidiary organs and other appointments”, a sub-item entitled “Confirmation of the appointment of members of the Investments Committee”, and to allocate it to the Fifth Committee.
2. In accordance with the provisions of article 20 and section E of annex III to the Regulations, Rules and Pension Adjustment System of the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund,¹ the Secretary-General, after consultation with the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Board and the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, submits for confirmation by the General Assembly the appointment of Kemi Adeosun (Nigeria) and Keiko Honda (Japan) as ad hoc members of the Investments Committee for one-year terms beginning on 1 January 2018.
