Conference on the Establishment of a Middle East Zone Free of Nuclear Weapons and Other Weapons of Mass Destruction Third session New York, 14–18 November 2022

Information for participating States, observer States and invited international organizations

Summary

The present document contains preliminary information for participating States and observer States mentioned in General Assembly decision 73/546 and invited international organizations attending the third session of the Conference on the Establishment of a Middle East Zone Free of Nuclear Weapons and other Weapons of Mass Destruction. Any additional information that may be necessary will be provided as needed. Documentation and other information will be posted on the website of the session (https://meetings.unoda.org/meeting/me-nwmdfz-2022) as they become available.





I. Dates and venue

1. In accordance with General Assembly decision 73/546 and as decided by participating States of the Conference on the Establishment of a Middle East Zone Free of Nuclear Weapons and other Weapons of Mass Destruction, the third session of the Conference will be held at United Nations Headquarters, in New York from 14 to 18 November 2022.

2. The opening meeting will begin at 10 a.m. on Monday, 14 November 2022, and will be held in Conference Room 4. From the morning of 15 November, meetings will be held in Conference Room 11.

II. List of speakers and general debate

3. The list of speakers for the general debate will be open from 1 November 2022, at 10 a.m. (New York time). States parties wishing to add the names of their representatives to the list of speakers for the general debate are invited to do so through the eSpeakers module of the e-deleGATE portal (https://edelegat.un.int). Representatives of international organizations without access to the portal who wish to be inscribed on the list of speakers are invited to make their submissions in writing to Antonina Poliakova (poliakova@un.org), with a copy to Marya Canham (canham@un.org) and Yazan Ammus (yazan.ammus@un.org).

4. Given the time allocated for the general debate, it would be desirable for statements not to exceed 10 minutes so that the debate may be completed within the envisaged time frame.

5. Delegations are requested to submit electronic versions of their statements in both PDF and Microsoft Word formats to estatements@un.org and to Ms. Poliakova (poliakova@un.org), with a copy to Ms. Canham (canham@un.org) and Mr. Ammus (yazan.ammus@un.org). The name of the meeting concerned and of the speaker should be indicated in the subject line of the email and in the heading of the statement. The statement should be submitted well in advance of the meeting, and in all cases no later than two hours before delivery, and not in hard copy. Statements will remain embargoed until their delivery. They will be made available for viewing and downloading from the Journal of the United Nations portal upon delivery, as well as on the website of the Conference in due course.

III. List of participants

6. Participating States and observer States mentioned in decision 73/546 and relevant international organizations invited to participate in the Conference are requested to submit the credentials of their representatives by 10 November 2022, in accordance with the well-established practices of the United Nations, through the online e-Credentials platform, which can be accessed via the e-deleGATE portal. States parties are requested to deliver an original hard copy to the Secretary-General of the Conference, Xiaoyu Wang, Office for Disarmament Affairs, room S-30SM2.

7. Participating States and observer States are also requested to inform the Secretariat of the composition of their delegations to the third session by uploading an official communication through the e-deleGATE portal as early as possible, and in all cases no later than 10 November 2022.

IV. Registration procedures

8. Permanent missions of participating States and the observer States mentioned in decision 73/546¹ and liaison offices of invited international organizations in New York are required to submit their registration requests using the online eRegistration system, which is available through the e-deleGATE portal. Information on the system is provided in the guidelines on eRegistration and the frequently asked questions section of the website of the Protocol and Liaison Service (www.un.org/dgacm/en/content/protocol/meetings). All registration requests must be submitted through the eRegistration system. The deadline for the submission of online registration requests is 1 November 2022.

9. Registration must match the names provided in the official letter sent to notify the Secretariat of the composition of the delegation (see para. 6).

V. Documentation

10. All documents for the session will be made available on the website of the Conference. No hard copies of pre-session documents will be provided.

VI. Side events

11. The number of rooms available for lunchtime side events during the session is very limited. However, States and organizations that plan to hold a side event utilizing United Nations facilities may apply for consideration by completing the form annexed to the present document (annex I) and submitting it to Diane Barnes (diane.barnes@un.org) by 14 October 2022. The availability of facilities is not guaranteed, and applications will be considered with attention to the needs and requirements of the applicant. Please note that submissions sent by email are not valid before their receipt has been acknowledged by the Secretariat. Please also note that, depending on the services requested, the nature of the event or the identity of participants, speakers or the audience, the United Nations may request that you provide additional information or accept additional obligations before the request is approved. Side events may involve additional costs, which are to be borne by the requester.
