
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Open-ended working group on conventional ammunition Third substantive session New York, 13-17 February 2023

Logistical arrangements and other organizational matters

Note by the Secretariat

- 1. The General Assembly, in its resolution 76/233, decided to establish an openended working group to elaborate a set of political commitments as a new global framework that would address existing gaps in through-life ammunition management, including international cooperation and assistance, without prejudice to national legal systems addressing national ammunition ownership, possession and use, and would be part of a comprehensive framework to support safe, secure and sustainable through-life ammunition management at the national, subregional, regional and global levels, building upon and complementing existing frameworks, whereas cooperation at the regional and subregional levels should be considered on a voluntary basis.
- 2. The third substantive session of the open-ended working group will be held from 13 to 17 February 2023 in Conference Room 1 at United Nations Headquarters in New York.
- 3. The session is scheduled to be held in person, with plenary meetings from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and from 3 to 6 p.m. Informal meetings may be held in a hybrid format.
- 4. United Nations Web TV coverage will be provided for the duration of the session (open, formal meetings only). UN Web TV allows for live-streaming in all six official languages of the United Nations but cannot be used to take the floor to deliver statements. 5. The e-deleGATE portal is operational for the work of the group and is available at https://edelegate.un.int/.

List of participants

6. Formal credentials are not requested for participation in the work of the group. However, permanent missions are requested to communicate the composition of their





delegations to the Secretariat by registering the members of their delegations through the "e-List of participants" module on the e-deleGATE portal, for inclusion in the list of participants, which will be issued as an official document. Delegates participating in person should be included on the list of participants.

List of speakers

7. There is no pre-established list of speakers. Delegates in the room can register to speak by pressing the microphone button on their desks in accordance with the usual practice.

eStatements

8. In order to facilitate the provision of interpretation, speakers are requested to submit their statements (in both PDF and Microsoft Word formats) by email to estatements@un.org. The name of the meeting and of the speaker should be indicated in the subject line of the email and in the heading of the statement. The statement should be submitted well in advance of the meeting, but no later than two hours before delivery, and not in hard copy. The statements will remain embargoed until their delivery.

Working papers

9. Member States can submit working papers on matters under consideration by the group, which will be made available on its dedicated website. Working papers can be submitted to the Secretariat at conventionalarms-unoda@un.org.
