## AGENDA ITEM 16

Election of six members of the Economic and Social Council (continued)*

1. The PRESIDENT: The General Assembly will proceed this afternoon to elect six members of the Ecom nomic and Social Council. These members are to fill the vacancies which will occur in the Council on 31 December 1960, when six of the existing members of the Council retire. The six members of the Council who will retire on 31 December are: Chile, China, Costa Rica, France, Netherlands and Sudan. In the case of the Economic and Social Council, outgoing members are eligible for immediate re-election.
2. For the information of the members of the Assembly, I would recall that the following countries will continue to be members of the Economic and Social Council after 1 January 1961: Afghanistan, Brazil, Bulgaria, Denmark, Japan, New Zealand, Poland, Spain, Union of Soviet Sccialist Republics, United Kingdom, United States and Venezuela. These countries are therefore not eligible in the present elections.
3. I would ask representatives to write on the ballot paper the names of the six countries for whom they wish to vote, Ballot papers containing more than six names will be declared invalid.
