2022 Meeting of the High Contracting Parties to the Convention*

1. The Sixth Review Conference of the High Contracting Parties to the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to have Indiscriminate Effects, to be held in Geneva on 13-17 December 2021, is to decide to convene the 2022 Meeting of the High Contracting Parties.
2. This document is submitted to assist the decision of the High Contracting Parties and provides total estimated costs of US\$ 816,000 for a three-day meeting, including conference servicing requirements of US\$ 195,100 and non-conference-servicing elements (ISU staff costs) of US\$ 620,900. A breakdown of these costs is provided in the attached tables.
3. The costs are estimated on the basis of past experience and anticipated workload. The actual costs will be determined after the closure of the meeting and completion of related work, with all relevant expenditures recorded in the accounts. At that time, any adjustments in the contributions made by the participants sharing the costs will be determined accordingly.
4. In accordance with the financial measures adopted in 2017, the assessment of contributions towards the cost of preparing and holding meetings shall be calculated on the basis of the United Nations scale of assessment, adjusted to take into account the difference between the United Nations membership on the one hand and the number of States other than High Contracting Parties in attendance combined with the number of High Contracting Parties on the other. States that are not High Contracting Parties but take part in the meetings share the costs to the extent of their respective rates of assessment under the United Nations scale of assessments.
5. Assessment notices will be prepared based on the approved overall estimated costs and applicable cost-sharing formula. Since the above-mentioned activities shall have no financial implication for the regular budget of the Organization, High Contracting Parties should proceed with the payment of their share of the estimated costs as soon as assessment notices have been received.
