#### **Annotations**

#### 1. Election of the Bureau

Rule 18 of the rules of procedure of the Council provides that, each year at the commencement of its 1st meeting, the Council shall elect a President and four Vice-Presidents from among the representatives of its members. The membership of the Council in 2002 is given in the annex below. According to the rotation of the office of President among the regional groups, the President for 2002 should be the representative of a member of the Eastern European States group. The four Vice-Presidents of the Council shall be elected on the basis of equitable geographical distribution from the other four regional groups.

The President and Vice-Presidents shall constitute the Bureau. The Council, upon the recommendation of the President, shall decide on the special responsibilities of each Vice-President.

Pursuant to Council resolution 1988/77, a meeting of the Council will be held on 14 January 2002 for the election of the Bureau.

#### 2. Adoption of the agenda and other organizational matters

Rule 13 of the rules of procedure of the Council provides that, at the beginning of each session, after the election of the Bureau when required under rule 18, the Council shall adopt the agenda for the session.

The present provisional agenda has been prepared in conformity with the provisions of General Assembly resolution 48/162 and with other relevant legislative decisions, including, in particular, the provisions of Assembly resolution 50/227.

# Strengthening the work of the Commission on Science and Technology for Development

By its decision 2001/323, the Council decided to further defer to its resumed organizational session for 2002, in May 2002, the consideration of draft resolution III, entitled "Strengthening the work of the Commission on Science and Technology for Development", contained in the report of the Commission on its fifth session.

# Applications from two intergovernmental organizations for accession to the status of specialized agencies of the United Nations system

The Council will have before it the applications for accession to the status of specialized agencies of the United Nations system from the following two intergovernmental organizations: the International Civil Defence Organization and the World Tourism Organization.

Upon receiving the applications, the Bureau of the Council, in accordance with Articles 57 and 63, paragraph 1, of the Charter of the United Nations, will review and circulate them for the consideration of the Council.

### 3. Basic programme of work of the Council

In accordance with rule 8 of the rules of procedure of the Council, the Council shall draw up, at its organizational session, with the assistance of the Secretary-General, its basic programme of work.

The Council will have before it the proposed basic programme of work of the Council for 2002 and 2003 prepared by the Secretariat in accordance with the relevant decisions of the Council and of the General Assembly.

In its decision 2001/299, the Council decided that the high-level segment of its substantive session of 2002 would be devoted to consideration of the following theme: "The contribution of human resources development, including in the areas of health and education, to the process of development".

In the same decision, the Council decided that the coordination segment of its substantive session of 2002 would be devoted to consideration of the following theme: "Strengthening further the Economic and Social Council, building on its recent achievements, to help it fulfil the role ascribed to it in the Charter of the United Nations as contained in the United Nations Millennium Declaration".

The Council's attention is drawn to General Assembly resolution 52/12 B by which the Assembly decided to create a humanitarian affairs segment of the Council. At its organizational session for 1999, the Council decided, in its decision 1999/208, to select a theme for the humanitarian affairs segment of its substantive session of 1999. The Council may wish to follow a similar procedure for its humanitarian affairs segment in 2002.

Pursuant to Council decision 1982/174 on the rationalization of the work of the Council, the Council decided to identify, at its organizational session, a subject relating to interregional cooperation, of common interest to all regions, for detailed consideration under the agenda item on regional cooperation, and to request the executive secretaries of the regional commissions to submit their joint recommendations in that regard to the Council at its annual organizational session.

Pursuant to Council resolution 1988/77 on the revitalization of the Council, the President, prior to the organizational session, and with the cooperation of the other members of the Bureau, will arrange for consultations with members of the Council on the draft programme of work and provisional agenda prepared by the Secretary-General and make proposals thereon for consideration by the Council.

### **Committee of Experts on Public Administration**

By the text contained in the annex to Council resolution 2001/45 entitled "Restructuring and revitalization of the Group of Experts on the United Nations Programme in Public Administration and Finance", the name of the Group of Experts was changed to the "Committee of Experts on Public Administration" and changes were made as well in its membership and frequency of meetings. Pursuant to the same resolution, the Council shall be called upon to approve the nomination by the Secretary-General, in consultation with Member States, of the 24 experts constituting the Committee, whose term of office shall be four years.
