### **A. High-level segment**

#### **2. High-level segment**

##### **(a) High-level policy dialogue with international financial and trade institutions**

In accordance with General Assembly resolutions 48/162 and 61/16, the Council will hold a high-level policy dialogue with the executive heads of international financial and trade institutions on current developments in the world economy during its high-level segment.

**(b) Development Cooperation Forum**

In paragraph 155 (b) of its resolution 60/1, entitled “2005 World Summit Outcome”, the General Assembly mandated the Council to hold a biennial high-level Development Cooperation Forum to review trends in international development cooperation, including strategies, policies and financing, promote greater coherence among the development activities of different development partners and strengthen the links between the normative and operational work of the United Nations.

In paragraph 5 of its resolution 61/16, the General Assembly further requested the Council to consider launching the Forum during the high-level segment of its substantive session of 2007 and to meet thereafter in New York, starting in 2008. Accordingly, the Development Cooperation Forum was launched in Geneva in July 2007, and the Council held its first biennial meeting in New York in 2008.

The Development Cooperation Forum will consider an analytical background report prepared by the Secretary-General on a review of trends and progress in international development cooperation (Assembly resolution 61/16, paras. 6 and 7).

Pursuant to paragraph 155 of General Assembly resolution 60/1, entitled “2005 World Summit Outcome”, and paragraph 10 of Assembly resolution 61/16, on the strengthening of the Economic and Social Council, the Council will have before it the report of the Secretary-General on the theme of the annual ministerial review (Council decision 2008/258). The report will incorporate inputs from a number of relevant United Nations entities and will also provide policy recommendations for consideration by the Council.

In addition, the Council will have before it relevant parts of the report of the Committee for Development Policy on its twelfth session.

including a thematic discussion on a theme from the economic, social and related fields to be decided by the Council and informed by a report of the Secretary-General.

Pursuant to Council decision 2009/210, the theme for the thematic discussion at its substantive session of 2010 will be “Current global and national trends and challenges and their impact on gender equality and empowerment of women”.

### **B. Operational activities segment**

#### **3. Operational activities of the United Nations for international development cooperation**

The Council, in its decision 2009/216, decided to defer consideration of the report of the High-level Committee on South-South Cooperation on its sixteenth session to the substantive session of the Council of 2010.

#### **(a) Follow-up to policy recommendations of the General Assembly and the Council**

At its sixty-second session, in its resolution 62/208, the General Assembly:

- In paragraph 93, requested the Secretary-General to report on an annual basis to the Economic and Social Council at its substantive session on the functioning of the resident coordinator system, including costs and benefits. In that regard, in paragraph 13 of its resolution 2008/2, the Council requested the Secretary-General, in his annual report on the functioning of the resident coordinator system, to report on the participation and support to the functioning of the resident coordinator system of the United Nations system, including the non-resident agencies, and on progress in enhancing development impact, coherence, effectiveness and efficiency and costs and benefits of coordination through the resident coordinator system, with specific attention to the regional and country levels.
- In paragraph 112, requested the executive boards and governing bodies of the United Nations funds, programmes and specialized agencies to assess the progress achieved, including costs and benefits, in the area of simplification

and harmonization of the United Nations development system at the global, regional and country levels, analyse the potential impacts on development programming and report to the Economic and Social Council at its substantive session on an annual basis.

- In paragraph 142, requested the Secretary-General, on the basis of information provided by the funds, programmes and specialized agencies of the United Nations development system, to submit to the Economic and Social Council, at its substantive sessions of 2009 and 2010, detailed reports on results achieved and measures and processes implemented in follow-up to the resolution on the triennial comprehensive policy review in order to evaluate the implementation of the resolution, with a view to ensuring its full implementation.

At its sixty-third session, the General Assembly:

- In paragraph 4 of its resolution 63/232, requested the United Nations Development Programme and the Department of Economic and Social Affairs of the Secretariat to take the necessary steps to integrate by 2010 information from the report on United Nations system technical cooperation expenditures and its statistical addendum into the report on the comprehensive statistical analysis of the financing of operational activities for development of the United Nations system.
- In paragraph 21 of its resolution 63/311, requested the Secretary-General, in consultation with the United Nations System Chief Executives Board for Coordination, to regularly inform the Council about progress being made and challenges encountered in the simplification and harmonization of business practices within the United Nations development system and to refer any matter requiring an intergovernmental decision to the relevant intergovernmental bodies.

The Council, in paragraph 13 of its resolution 2008/2, requested the Secretary-General, in his annual report on the functioning of the resident coordinator system, to report on the participation and support of the United Nations system, including the non-resident agencies, and on progress in enhancing development impact, coherence, effectiveness and efficiency and costs and benefits of coordination through the resident coordinator system, with specific attention to the regional and country levels. The Council further requested the Secretary-General, in paragraph 22 of the resolution, to make every effort to ensure that the information provided in response to paragraph 112 of General Assembly resolution 62/208 is presented at future sessions of the Economic and Social Council in the form of a report.

The Council, in paragraph 4 of its resolution 2009/1, reiterated the request of the General Assembly to the executive heads of the United Nations funds, programmes and specialized agencies to continue to report annually to their governing bodies on measures taken and envisaged for the implementation of resolution 62/208. Furthermore, the Council, in paragraph 20 of the resolution, requested the United Nations Development Group, in close cooperation with the United Nations Development Programme, to further develop approaches and tools for measuring and reporting on the costs and benefits of coordination, including input on best practices and lessons learned from the field on the functioning of the resident coordinator system, and requested the Secretary-General to include in his report to be submitted to the Council at its substantive session in 2010, information on challenges and achievements.

The Council will have before it the annual reports of the Executive Boards of the United Nations Development Programme/United Nations Population Fund, the United Nations Children's Fund and the World Food Programme (General Assembly resolution 48/162, annex, Assembly resolution 62/208 and Council resolution 1995/51).

The Council also requested the funds and programmes, through their executive boards, to include in their annual reports to the Council: (a) a section outlining measures taken in the implementation of the provisions of the triennial policy review of operational activities; and (b) a section on the activities and measures undertaken within the designated theme of the high-level meeting of the operational activities segment (General Assembly resolution 62/208 and Council resolution 1994/33).

The reports include a thorough analysis of problems encountered and lessons learned, with emphasis on issues arising from the implementation of the Secretary-General's reform programme, the triennial comprehensive policy review and the follow-up to international conferences, so as to allow the Council to fulfil its coordinating role (General Assembly resolution 48/162, annex, Assembly resolution 53/192 and Council resolution 1995/51).

## C. Coordination segment

### 4. The role of the United Nations system in implementing the ministerial declaration of the high-level segment of the 2009 substantive session of the Economic and Social Council

The Council, in paragraph 10 of its resolution 2008/29, requested the Secretary-General to submit a report on measures taken to implement the ministerial declaration of the high-level segment of the Council for consideration by the Council at the coordination segment of its substantive session of the following year.

The Council, in paragraph 6 of its resolution 2009/5, entitled "Recovering from the crisis: a Global Jobs Pact", also requested the Secretary-General to report to the Council at its substantive session of 2010 on progress made in implementing the resolution.

The Council, in paragraph 10 of its resolution 2009/29, also requested the Secretary-General to prepare, taking into account the views of Member States, a report on the integrated and coordinated implementation of and follow-up to the outcomes of the major United Nations conferences and summits, in the light of relevant General Assembly resolutions, including resolution 61/16, which should additionally include recommendations on the periodicity of future reports, and to submit the report for consideration at its 2010 substantive session.

At its sixtieth session, the General Assembly, in its resolution 60/252, requested the Council to oversee the system-wide follow-up of the Geneva and Tunis outcomes of the World Summit on the Information Society, namely, the Declaration of Principles and the Plan of Action and the Tunis Commitment and the Tunis Agenda for the Information Society (see also Council resolution 2006/46). At its sixty-fourth session, in its resolution 64/187, the Assembly requested the Secretary-General to submit to it at its sixty-fifth session, through the Council, a report on the status of the implementation of and follow-up to resolution 64/187, on information and communication technologies for development.

The General Assembly, in paragraph 34 of its resolution 64/224, invited the Chairperson of the Committee on World Food Security to report, as part of the Committee's report to the Assembly at its sixty-fifth session, through the Council, on the implementation of the reform of and on progress made towards achieving the vision of the Committee.

At its organizational session for 2010, the Council decided that the theme of the humanitarian affairs segment for its substantive session of 2010 would be “Strengthening of the coordination of humanitarian assistance” (General Assembly resolution 52/12 B and Council decisions 1999/208 and 2010/208).

In its resolution 64/76, the General Assembly requested the Emergency Relief Coordinator to continue his efforts to strengthen the coordination of humanitarian assistance and called upon relevant United Nations organizations and other relevant intergovernmental organizations, as well as other humanitarian and relevant development actors, to continue to work with the Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs of the Secretariat to enhance the coordination, effectiveness and efficiency of humanitarian assistance, and requested the Secretary-General to report to the Assembly at its sixty-fifth session, through the Council at its substantive session of 2010, on progress made in strengthening the coordination of emergency humanitarian assistance of the United Nations and to submit a report to the Assembly on the detailed use of the Central Emergency Response Fund (Council resolution 2009/3).

The General Assembly, in its resolution 58/230, requested the President of the Council, with support from the Vice-Presidents, to enhance the Council's interactions through regular exchanges with the Bretton Woods institutions, the World Trade Organization and the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development on organizational matters related to the follow-up to the International Conference on Financing for Development, within the context of the preparations for the high-level meeting with those institutions, bearing in mind General Assembly resolution 57/270 B and Council resolution 2003/47, and to report thereon to the Council.

#### **(b) Review and coordination of the implementation of the Programme of Action for the Least Developed Countries for the Decade 2001-2010**

At its substantive session of 2009, the Council, in paragraph 20 of its resolution 2009/31, reiterated its request to the Secretary-General to include least developed country issues in all relevant reports in the economic, social and related fields in order to ensure follow-up to their development in the broader context of the world economy and contribute to preventing their marginalization while promoting their further integration into the world economy. The Council, in paragraph 21 of the same resolution, also requested the Secretary-General to submit an analytical and results-oriented annual progress report on the further implementation of the Programme of Action for the Least Developed Countries for the Decade 2001-2010 and to make available adequate resources, within existing resources, for the preparation of such a report. The report is submitted to the General Assembly,

through the Council, in response to paragraph 111 of the Programme of Action (see also Assembly resolution 62/203).

#### **(b) Proposed strategic framework for the period 2012-2013**

In accordance with rule 31 of the rules of procedure of the Council, the Secretary-General will circulate the proposed strategic framework for the period 2012-2013 covering activities in the economic, social and human rights fields. The Council will consider the relevant sections of the proposed strategic framework for the period 2012-2013 (General Assembly resolution 58/269 and Council resolution 1988/77).

#### **(c) International cooperation in the field of informatics**

At its substantive session of 2009, the Council, in paragraph 2 of its resolution 2009/9, requested the President of the Economic and Social Council to convene the Ad Hoc Open-ended Working Group on Informatics for one more year to enable it to carry out, from within existing resources, the due fulfilment of the provisions of the Council resolutions on this item, to facilitate the successful implementation of the initiatives being taken by the Secretary-General with regard to the use of information technology and to continue the implementation of measures required to achieve its objectives and, in that regard, requests the Working Group to continue its efforts to act as a bridge between the evolving needs of Member States and the

actions of the Secretariat, and also requests the Working Group to consider its future role, status and mandate and develop findings in that regard.

The Council also requested the Secretary-General, in paragraph 6 of the same resolution, to report to it at its substantive session of 2010 on action taken in follow-up to the resolution, including the findings of the Working Group and an assessment of its work and mandate.

At its substantive session of 2009, the Council, in paragraph 9 of its resolution 2009/4, decided to extend the mandate of the Ad Hoc Advisory Group on Haiti until the substantive session of the Council in July 2010, with the purpose of following closely and providing advice on Haiti's long-term development strategy to promote socio-economic recovery and stability, with particular attention to the need to ensure coherence and sustainability in international support for Haiti, based on the long-term national development priorities, building upon the interim cooperation framework and the growth and poverty reduction strategy paper, and stressing the need to avoid overlap and duplication with respect to existing mechanisms.

The Council also requested the Ad Hoc Advisory Group on Haiti, in paragraph 12 of the same resolution, to submit a report on its work, with recommendations, as appropriate, to the Council for its consideration at its substantive session of 2010.

The General Assembly, in its resolution 64/125, on assistance to the Palestinian people, requested the Secretary-General to submit a report to the Assembly at its sixty-fifth session, through the Council, on the implementation of the resolution, containing: (a) an assessment of the assistance actually received by the Palestinian people; and (b) an assessment of the needs still unmet and specific proposals for responding effectively to them.

*Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples by the specialized agencies and the international institutions associated with the United Nations.* At its sixty-fourth session, the General Assembly, in its resolution 64/99, and the Council, at its substantive session of 2009, in its resolution 2009/33, requested the specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system and international and regional organizations to examine and review conditions in each Non-Self-Governing Territory so that they might take appropriate measures to accelerate progress in the economic and social sectors of those Territories, and also requested the specialized

agencies and other organizations and bodies of the United Nations system and regional organizations to strengthen existing measures of support and to formulate appropriate programmes of assistance to the remaining Non-Self-Governing Territories, within the framework of their respective mandates, in order to accelerate progress in the economic and social sectors of those Territories.

In the same resolutions, the Assembly requested the Chair of the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples, and the Council requested the President of the Economic and Social Council, to continue to maintain close contact on those matters. The Council also requested the President to report to it thereon. In addition, the Council requested the Secretary-General to follow up on the implementation of the resolution, paying particular attention to cooperation and integration arrangements for maximizing the efficiency of the assistance activities undertaken by various organizations of the United Nations system, and to report thereon to the Economic and Social Council at its substantive session of 2010.
