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Coordination, programme and other questions: calendar of conferences and meetings in the economic, social and related fields

Provisional calendar of conferences and meetings in the economic, social and related fields for 2022 and 2023

Note by the Secretariat

Summary

In the present note, the Economic and Social Council is invited to review the provisional calendar of conferences and meetings for 2022 and 2023 in the economic, social and related fields and approve the meetings of its subsidiary bodies. The attention of the Council is drawn to the relevant provisions of General Assembly resolutions 45/264, 46/235, 50/227 and 61/16 on the restructuring and revitalization of the United Nations in the economic, social and related fields, and to Assembly resolution 68/1 on the review of the implementation of Assembly resolution 61/16 on the strengthening of the Council, which have been taken into account in the preparation of the calendar.

It should be noted that the calendar has been drafted in advance of the outcome of the General Assembly review of the implementation of its resolutions 74/298 and 72/305 regarding the Economic and Social Council, and of resolutions 74/298, 70/299 and 67/290 regarding the high-level political forum on sustainable development. The draft calendar of meetings and segments of the Economic and Social Council and of the high-level political forum on sustainable development will be updated as necessary in the light of the outcome of that process.

The Council is invited to consider further the biennialization of the sessions of its subsidiary bodies, in accordance with paragraph 2 (f) (ii) of its resolution 1988/77 and General Assembly resolution 50/206 A.

Attention is drawn to Council decision 1988/103, in which the Council decided to invite the Committee on Conferences to review the provisional biennial calendar of conferences and meetings of the Council in the economic, social and related fields and submit, as appropriate, its recommendations thereon to the Council.





- 1. The provisional calendar of conferences and meetings in the economic, social and related fields for 2022 and 2023, contained in the annex to the present document, has been prepared in accordance with the relevant General Assembly resolutions, in particular resolutions 37/14 C, 39/68 B and D, 40/243, 41/177, 41/213, 42/207 B, 45/264, 46/235, 50/227, 61/16, 68/1 and 72/305 and the relevant decisions and resolutions of the Economic and Social Council. Attention is drawn to the following decisions of the Council and the Assembly:
- (a) That on 13 December 2013, in accordance with Assembly resolution 68/1, the Council adjusted its programme of work to a July-to-July cycle and adopted transitional arrangements for the election of its Bureau, taking into account the relevant rules, regulations and practices with regard to the work of the Council, its subsidiary bodies and United Nations funds and programmes;
- (b) That the Council, as a Charter body, is entitled to convene meetings as and when needed, with full substantive support and conference services (Assembly resolution 61/16, para. 19);
- (c) That all meetings of subsidiary and associated organs should conform to the Council's schedule of meetings and not vice versa (decision adopted at the Council's 1837th meeting, on 28 July 1972, at the fifty-third session);
- (d) That the Secretary-General should ensure that meetings of the subsidiary bodies of the Council end at least eight weeks before the session of the Council at which their reports are to be considered (Council resolutions 1982/50, para. 1 (l), and 1988/77, para. 2 (f) (i));
- (e) That the subsidiary bodies of the Council, with the exception of the regional commissions, may not create either standing or ad hoc intersessional subsidiary bodies without prior approval of the Council (rule 24, para. 2, of the rules of procedure of the Council);
- (f) That the regular sessions of the Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific, the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean, the Economic Commission for Africa and the Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia and meetings of their subsidiary bodies may be held away from their headquarters when the commission concerned so decides, subject, in the case of regular sessions of the commissions, to the approval of the Council and the Assembly (Assembly resolution 40/243, sect. I, para. 4 (f));
- (g) That the Council would adopt, on a regular basis, a biennial cycle of meetings that would correspond to the programme budget cycle, for better administrative control (Council decision 281 (LXIII), para. (b));
- (h) That the regular sessions of the functional commissions and standing committees of the Council should normally have a duration of not more than eight working days; and, once the calendar of meetings has been adopted by the Council, no additional meetings involving departures from the biennial cycle of meetings would be authorized during the biennium (Council decision 1979/81, paras. (b) to (d), and Assembly resolution 34/50) and that the waiver to the headquarters rule contained in Assembly resolution 40/243 would be discontinued in the case of the functional commissions (Assembly resolution 49/221 A);
- (i) That the meetings of the high-level political forum on sustainable development under the auspices of the Assembly would be convened every four years by the President of the Assembly for a period of two days, at the beginning of the session of the Assembly, as well as on other occasions, on an exceptional basis, upon a decision by the Assembly; and that the meetings of the forum under the auspices of the Council would be convened annually by the President of the Council for a period

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of eight days, including a three-day ministerial segment to be held in the framework of the substantive session of the Council (Assembly resolution 67/290);

- (j) That the High-Level Dialogue on Financing for Development of the Assembly would be held back-to-back with the high-level political forum under the auspices of the Assembly when the forum is convened every four years (Assembly resolution 69/313, annex, para. 132);
- (k) That the frequency of meetings of the Committee of Experts on International Cooperation in Tax Matters would increase to two sessions per year, with a duration of four working days each, in order to strengthen its effectiveness and operational capacity (ibid., para. 29);
- (l) That a multi-stakeholder forum on science, technology and innovation for the Sustainable Development Goals would be convened once a year by the President of the Economic and Social Council before the meetings of the high-level political forum on sustainable development under the auspices of the Council for a period of two days to discuss science, technology and innovation cooperation around thematic areas for the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals, congregating all relevant stakeholders to actively contribute in their area of expertise (ibid., para. 123);
- (m) That the biennial Development Cooperation Forum would be convened prior to the high-level political forum, and that the Council was invited to consider timing its engagement with various intergovernmental bodies in order to support their contribution to the high-level political forum (Assembly resolution 70/299, para. 17). It is the understanding of the Secretariat that the Development Cooperation Forum will require two meetings each day, one in the morning and one in the afternoon, for a duration of two days, with conference resources to be provided from those allocated to the high-level segment of the Council session;
- (n) That the Council would strengthen the international arrangement on forests and extend it to 2030, and that the Forum on Forests would hold its annual sessions for a period of five days (Council resolution 2015/33, paras. 1 (a) and 6 (c));
- (o) That the integration segment would be held for one day immediately before the high-level political forum (Assembly resolution 72/305, para. 11);
- (p) That the meetings of the management segment would, in principle, last no more than two days, twice per cycle (ibid., paras. 23–24);
- (q) That dedicated management meetings would also be held to conduct elections to fill regular and outstanding vacancies in subsidiary bodies of the Council and related bodies, normally in the first half and last quarter of the year (ibid., para. 26);
- (r) That the Governing Council of the United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-Habitat) would be dissolved as a subsidiary organ of the Assembly and replaced with the UN-Habitat Assembly, in line with the findings and recommendations of the Open-ended Working Group established by the Chair of the Committee of Permanent Representatives to UN-Habitat, pursuant to Assembly resolution 72/226 (Assembly resolution 73/239, para. 2);
- (s) That the United Nations Conference on the Standardization of Geographical Names and the United Nations Group of Experts on Geographical Names would be discontinued in their current formats and be subsumed by a subsidiary body of the Council that would retain their respective mandates, where relevant, as well as resolutions of the United Nations Conference on the Standardization of Geographical Names and responsibility for the implementation thereof, would be named the United Nations Group of Experts on Geographical Names and would convene, beginning in 2019, biennial sessions over a period of five days in New York, with the option to convene sessions at an alternative United

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Nations venue or in a specific country, should a Member State commit to hosting and funding the session (Council resolution 2018/2).

- 2. The Committee on Conferences, at its 154th meeting, decided that requests for intersessional departures from the calendar of conferences should only be submitted to the Committee for its consideration if accompanied by a presentation of detailed substantive arguments supporting a proposed change in or an addition to the calendar. The Committee also decided to request the Secretariat to inform the Committee, as far in advance as possible, of the need for a postponement of sessions of United Nations bodies, together with a presentation of the substantive reasons necessitating a delay.
- 3. In its decision 1992/214, the Council decided to grant authority to its Bureau to approve intersessional departures from its approved calendar of conferences and meetings in respect of its subsidiary bodies when the Council was not in session and after consultation with the Committee on Conferences.
- 4. In its decision 1988/103, the Council decided to invite the Committee on Conferences to review the provisional biennial calendar of conferences and meetings of the Council in the economic, social and related fields, beginning with the calendar for 1990–1991, and submit, as appropriate, its recommendations thereon to the Council. The Committee on Conferences is scheduled to meet on 28 April 2021 to review the Council's provisional calendar of conferences and meetings for 2022 and 2023 and may submit recommendations to the Council at its management segment to be held on 8 and 9 June 2021.
- 5. In paragraph 2 (f) (ii) of its resolution 1988/77, the Council decided to further consider the biennialization of the sessions of its subsidiary bodies. The subsidiary bodies of the Council and other bodies in the economic, social and related fields that meet biennially are the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean, the Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia, the Economic Commission for Europe, the United Nations Group of Experts on Geographical Names, the Committee of Experts on the Transport of Dangerous Goods and on the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals, the High-level Committee on South-South Cooperation, the United Nations Environment Assembly of the United Nations Environment Programme and the Meeting of Heads of National Drug Law Enforcement Agencies, Europe, of the Commission on Narcotic Drugs.
- 6. The Council may wish to consider further the question of the biennialization of its subsidiary bodies in the context of its review of the mandates, composition, functions and working methods of its functional commissions and expert groups and bodies (see Council resolution 1996/41 and Assembly resolution 50/227).
- 7. In response to paragraph 16 of section II of General Assembly resolution 66/233, in which the Assembly requested the Secretary-General to highlight any duplications and redundancies in conference servicing with a view to identifying innovative ideas, potential synergies and other cost-saving measures, the Secretariat made a proposal (A/67/127, paras. 13–15), which briefly described the mandates of the Council and the Committee on Conferences to review the provisional biennial calendar of meetings in the economic, social and related fields in odd-numbered years and examined the duplication and redundancy of preparing and issuing two almost identical draft calendars within a short period of time.
- 8. In that regard, the Council, in paragraph 2 of its resolution 2017/27, requested the Secretariat to propose to the Bureau of the Council at its 2018 session a streamlined list of bodies whose conferences and meetings should be included in future provisional calendars of conferences to be considered by the Council starting at its 2019 session. In its resolution 2018/30, the Council approved the streamlined

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list of bodies annexed to the resolution, to be updated, as necessary, by the Secretariat in consultation with the Bureau in the light of relevant decisions on the working arrangements of the Council to be adopted by the Council or the General Assembly.

9. In the preparation of the provisional calendar, due regard has been taken of General Assembly resolution 53/208, in particular paragraph 11, and paragraph 6 of Assembly resolution 75/244, in which it was decided that United Nations bodies should be invited to avoid holding meetings on Orthodox Good Friday, Yom Kippur, the Day of Vesak, Diwali, Gurpurab, Orthodox Christmas and Nowruz and that these arrangements should be taken into account when drafting future calendars and meetings. During the biennium 2022–2023, these days occur on the dates set out in the table below, pending final confirmation from the Office of Human Resources of the Secretariat.
