**1471 (XLVII). The establishment of an intergovernmental tourism organization**

*The Economic and Social Council,*

*Recalling* its resolution 1449 (XLVII) of 7 August 1969 on the development of tourism,

*Having considered* the report of the Secretary-General on the constitutional, organizational and financial implications of the establishment of an intergovernmental tourism organization,<sup>13</sup>

*Recommends* the General Assembly to adopt the following draft resolution:

*"The General Assembly,*

*"Having considered* the note by the Secretary-General,<sup>14</sup> transmitting the report of the Intergovernmental Conference on Tourism held at Sofia in May 1969, and the resolution adopted at that Conference on the creation of an intergovernmental tourism organization,

*"Having also considered* the report of the Secretary-General<sup>15</sup> called for in Economic and Social Council resolution 1449 (XLVII) of 7 August 1969,

*"Taking into account* resolution XXI/5 of November 1969 adopted by the General Assembly of the International Union of Official Travel Organizations at its twenty-first session,<sup>15</sup> held at Dublin from 28 October to 5 November 1969 on the adaptation of the Union to its present and future responsibilities,

*"Acknowledging* the vital contribution that international tourism is making to the economic, social, cultural and educational progress of mankind and in safeguarding world peace,

*"Taking into account* the important role that tourism can play in the national economy, particularly in that of the developing countries,

*"Considering* the active interest taken by the United Nations, its organs and specialized agencies in various fields related to tourism, and the continuing need for co-ordination of their activities in these fields,

*"Conscious* of the leading role that the Union has hitherto played in the field of tourism and the technical ability and experience that it has built up,

*"Recognizing,* nevertheless, that the operational capacity of the Union in the field of tourism has been limited by its status as a non-governmental organization,

*"Taking note* of the determination reaffirmed by the General Assembly of the Union in its resolution XXI/5, to set up as promptly as possible and by the most appropriate means a tourism organization of an intergovernmental character,

*"Further taking note* that in that resolution the Union recognized that the procedure indicated by the Intergovernmental Conference on Tourism for the creation of an intergovernmental tourism organization within the United Nations does not necessarily constitute the only means of establishing the best organization for world tourism,

*"1. Believes* that a formula that would allow agreement to be reached more readily among Governments for the establishment of an international tourism organization of an intergovernmental character, particularly to assist the developing countries, would be:

*"(a) The conversion* of the International Union of Official Travel Organizations into an intergovernmental organization through a revision of its statutes;

*"(b) The establishment* of operational links between the United Nations and the transformed Union by means of a formal agreement;

*"2. Takes note* of the recommendation contained in resolution XXI/5 of the General Assembly of the International Union of Official Travel Organizations, requesting the President of the Union to entrust a working group with the preparation of its draft revised statutes, bearing in mind the principles laid down by the General Assembly of the Union at its twentieth session held in Tokyo in October 1967 and by the Intergovernmental Conference on Tourism held at Sofia in May 1969, and to convene an extraordinary General Assembly of the Union to draw up and adopt the statutes of an intergovernmental organization;

*"3. Recommends* those States whose national official tourist organizations are members of the Union to take joint action at its forthcoming extraordinary General Assembly to amend the statutes of the Union in order to give the organization an intergovernmental character;

*"4. Invites* States whose national official tourist organizations are members of the Union to approve and adopt, in accordance with their respective internal procedures, the procedure outlined in paragraph 3

above for the creation of an international tourism organization of an intergovernmental character and, accordingly, to give the necessary instructions and powers to their representatives to the Union;

"5. *Decides*, once the statutes of the Union have been changed, that:

"(a) An agreement between the United Nations and the Union should be concluded which would establish close co-operation and relationships between the United Nations and the transformed Union, define the modalities of such co-operation and relationships, and recognize the decisive and central role that the Union is to play in the field of world tourism in co-operation with the existing machinery within the United Nations;

"(b) The Union should function as an executing agency of the United Nations Development Programme and participate in the activities of the Programme in order to assist in the preparation and implementation of technical assistance and pre-

investment projects in the field of tourism, financed by the Programme, and consideration should be given to enabling the Union to function as a participating and executing agency of the Programme;

"(c) Necessary procedures should be elaborated to enable the Union to submit, for the consideration of the Economic and Social Council, recommendations and proposals relating to international agreements to be drawn up in the field of tourism;

"6. *Requests* the Secretary-General, in co-operation with the Administrator of the United Nations Development Programme and the Secretary-General of the International Union of Official Travel Organizations, to prepare a report containing concrete proposals on measures to be taken for the full implementation of the provisions mentioned in paragraph 5 above, for submission to the Economic and Social Council at its forty-ninth session."

### **Other decision**

#### **Procedure for the consideration of the annual report of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees and of the report of the Executive Board of the United Nations Children's Fund**

##### **(Item 9)**

At its 1640th meeting, on 27 October 1969, the Council on the recommendation of the Secretary-General<sup>16</sup> decided that in future the annual report of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees would be retained on the agenda of the Council's summer session on the understanding that the report would be transmitted to the General Assembly without debate unless the Council were to decide otherwise, at the specific request of one or more of its members or of the High Commissioner, at the time of the adoption of the agenda.

At the same meeting, the Council also decided to recommend to the General Assembly that the review of the work of the United Nations Children's Fund, in the form of a separate discussion in the Third Committee, should take place once every two years.

### **SPECIAL QUESTIONS**

#### **1468 (XLVII). Assistance to Tunisia in connexion with the floods of October 1969**

##### *The Economic and Social Council,*

*Noting with deep regret* the tragic consequences of the severe floods in Tunisia, which caused hundreds of deaths, left tens of thousands of persons homeless and caused very extensive material damage,

*Recalling* General Assembly resolutions 2034 (XX) of 7 December 1965 and 2435 (XXIII) of 19 December 1968,

*Noting* the energetic and urgent measures taken by the Government of Tunisia to provide relief for the victims of the floods and to restore normal living conditions in the devastated areas,

*Further noting with appreciation* the assistance rendered to the victims of this disaster by many nations, the United Nations family of organizations, non-governmental organizations and individuals,

1. *Expresses its deep sympathy* to the people and Government of Tunisia regarding this catastrophe;

2. *Invites* Member States and non-governmental organizations to consider ways and means of rendering whatever further assistance they may be in a position to offer to the Government of Tunisia;

3. *Requests* the Secretary-General of the United Nations, the heads of the specialized agencies, the Executive Directors of the World Food Programme and the United Nations Children's Fund, and the Administrator of the United Nations Development Programme, in the light of the funds available, to bear in mind the needs of the Government of Tunisia in connexion with its plans for the reconstruction of the devastated areas when deciding on the services to be provided to Member States.

**1469 (XLVII). Assistance to Yugoslavia in connexion with the earthquake at Banja Luka**

*The Economic and Social Council,*

*Noting with deep regret the tragic consequences of the earthquake in Yugoslavia, which devastated the city of Banja Luka and the surrounding villages, causing great human casualties and vast material damage,*

*Recalling General Assembly resolutions 2034 (XX) of 7 December 1965 and 2435 (XXIII) of 19 December 1968,*

*Noting the urgent measures taken by the Government of Yugoslavia to provide relief for the victims of the earthquake and to restore normal living conditions in the devastated areas,*

1. *Expresses its deep sympathy to the people and Government of Yugoslavia regarding this catastrophe;*

2. *Invites Member States and non-governmental organizations to consider ways and means of rendering whatever assistance they may be in a position to offer to the Government of Yugoslavia;*

3. *Requests the Secretary-General of the United Nations, the heads of the specialized agencies, the Executive Directors of the World Food Programme and the United Nations Children's Fund, and the Administrator of the United Nations Development Programme, in the light of the funds available, to bear in mind the needs of the Government of Yugoslavia in connexion with its plans for the reconstruction of the devastated areas when deciding on the services to be provided to Member States.*

## OTHER DECISIONS

### **Report on the position concerning infringements of trade union rights in the Portuguese colonies in Africa**

#### **(Item 8)**

At its 1645th meeting, on 31 October 1969, the Council decided to defer consideration of agenda item 8, "Report on the position concerning infringements of trade union rights in the Portuguese colonies in Africa", until the organizational meetings of the forty-eighth session in January 1970.

### **Appointment to fill a vacancy in the Committee for Development Planning**

#### **(Item 12)**

At its 1642nd meeting, on 28 October 1969, the Council approved the proposal of the Secretary-General to appoint Mr. J. H. Mensah, as a member of the Committee for Development Planning for the period beginning on 28 October 1969 and ending on 31 December 1971, to replace the late Mr. T. J. Mboya.<sup>17</sup>

### **Calendar of Conferences and meetings for 1970 and 1971**

#### **(Item 10)**

At its 1646th meeting, on 31 October 1969, the Council decided that:

(a) The fifth session of the Preparatory Committee for the Second United Nations Development Decade should be held in New York from 24 February to 13 March 1970;

(b) Its forty-ninth session, at Geneva, should be held from 6 to 31 July 1970;

(c) The twenty-third session of the Commission on the Status of Women should be held at Geneva from 23 March to 10 April 1970.

At the same meeting the Council approved the calendar of conferences and meetings for 1970 and 1971,<sup>18</sup> as amended,<sup>19</sup> on the understanding that the Secretary-General would endeavour to arrange, through the Committee on Conferences, for the twenty-sixth session of

the Commission on Human Rights to meet in 1970 from 24 February to 27 March rather than from 17 February to 23 March.<sup>20</sup>

### **Amendment of rules of procedure of the Council and its functional commissions**

#### **(Item 15)**

At its 1647th meeting on 17 November 1969, the Council, as a result of the measures it adopted during its forty-seventh session to improve the organization of its work<sup>21</sup> and consequent upon its approval of the calendar of conferences and meetings for 1970 and 1971,<sup>22</sup> decided:

(a) To adopt, on a provisional basis, the Secretary-General's proposals<sup>23</sup> for amendment of the relevant rules of procedure of the Council and of other organizational changes, and to suspend rules 2, 9 and 14 of its rules of procedure;

(b) To consider, in the light of experience with the new programme of Conferences and Meetings in 1970, the revision of its rules of procedure at its first regular session in 1971.

At the same meeting, the Council also decided, on the proposal of the Secretary-General,<sup>24</sup> to replace the reference to the Interim Committee on the Programme of Conferences in rule 2 of the rules of procedure of the functional commissions, by a reference to the Committee on Conferences established by the General Assembly.

### **Consideration of the provisional agenda for the organizational meetings of the forty-eighth session**

#### **(Item 11)**

At its 1649th meeting, on 18 November 1969, the Council approved the provisional agenda for the organizational meetings of the forty-eighth session<sup>25</sup> to be held from 12 to 14 January 1970.
